the original version of the grimms tales in english for the first time in an acclaimed illustrated edition when jacob and wilhelm grimm published their children s and household tales in 1812 followed by a second volume in 1815 they had no idea that such stories as rapunzel hansel and gretel and cinderella would become the most celebrated in the world yet few people today are familiar with the majority of tales from the two early volumes since in the next four decades the grimms would publish six other editions each extensively revised in content and style for the very first time the original folk and fairy tales of the brothers grimm makes available in english all 156 stories from the 1812 and 1815 editions these narrative gems newly translated and brought together in one beautiful book are accompanied by sumptuous new illustrations from award winning artist andrea dezsö from the frog king to the golden key wondrous worlds unfold heroes and heroines are rewarded weaker animals triumph over the strong and simple bumpkins prove themselves not so simple after all esteemed fairy tale scholar jack zipes offers accessible translations that retain the spare description and engaging storytelling style of the originals indeed this is what makes the tales from the 1812 and 1815 editions unique they reflect diverse voices rooted in oral traditions that are absent from the grimms later more embellished collections of tales zipes s introduction gives important historical context and the book includes the grimms prefaces and notes a delight to read the original folk and fairy tales of the brothers grimm presents these peerless stories to a whole new generation of readers

before the brothers grimm published their now world famous childrens and household tales in 1812 they had sent their manuscript containing approximately 51 tales to their friend clemens brentano who also wanted to publish children s tales the brothers asked him to return their manuscript when he was finished with it but he never did while they went on to publish their tales their own copies of the original manuscripts for the first volume of the tales do not exist anymore by accident or fortunate circumstance the manuscript they sent to brentano survived and can be read today the 1810 grimm manuscripts is the first english language translation of the grimms kinder und hausmärchen as they were in the fall of 1810 it is the first written documentation of the tales as the brothers heard and saw them it shows the very first written documentation of the grimms versions of snow white sleeping beauty the frog king and many other tales

grimms fairy tales originally known as the children s and household tales german kinder und hausmärchen is a german collection of fairy tales by the brothers grimm jacob and wilhelm first published on 20 december 1812 vol 1 of the first edition contained 86 stories which were followed by 70 more tales numbered consecutively in the 1st edition vol 2 in 1815 by the seventh edition in 1857 the corpus of tales had expanded to 200 tales and 10 children s legends it is listed by unesco in its memory of the world registry origin jacob and wilhelm grimm were two of ten children from dorothea née zimmer and philipp wilhelm grimm philipp was a highly regarded district magistrate in steinau an der straße about 50 kilometres 31 mi from hanau jacob and wilhelm were sent to school for a classical education once they were of age while their father was working they were very hard working pupils



throughout their education they followed in their father's footsteps and started to pursue a degree in law and German history in 1796 their father died at the age of 44 from pneumonia this was a tragic time for the Grimms because the family lost all financial support and relied on their aunt Henriette Zimmer and grandfather Johann Hermann Zimmer at the age of 11 Jacob was compelled to be head of the household and provide for his family after downsizing their home because of financial reasons Henriette sent Jacob and Wilhelm to study at the prestigious high school Lyzeum in Kassel in school their grandfather wrote to them saying that because of their current situation they needed to apply themselves industriously to secure their future welfare

Children's and household tales German *Kinder und Hausmärchen* commonly known as Grimms' fairy tales German *Grimms Märchen* is a collection of German fairy tales published by Jacob and Wilhelm Grimm the Brothers Grimm on December 20, 1812 the Grimms published the first volume of the first edition it contained 86 stories the second volume of 70 stories was published in 1814 for the second edition two volumes were issued in 1819 and a third in 1822 totalling 170 tales the third edition appeared in 1837 fourth edition 1840 fifth edition 1843 sixth edition 1850 seventh edition 1857 stories were added and also deleted from one edition to the next until the seventh held 211 tales all editions were extensively illustrated first by Philipp Grot Johann and after his death in 1892 by Robert Leinweber the first volumes were much criticized because they were considered unsuitable for children both for the scholarly information included and the subject matter many changes through the editions such as turning the wicked mother of the first edition in Snow White and Hansel and Gretel to a stepmother were probably made with an eye to such criticism they removed sexual references such as Rapunzel's innocently asking why her dress was getting tight around her belly and thus naively revealing her pregnancy and the prince's visits to her stepmother but in many respects violence particularly when punishing villains was increased in 1825 the Grimms published their *Kleine Ausgabe* or small edition a selection of 50 tales designed for child readers this children's version went through ten editions between 1825 and 1858 the work of the Brothers Grimm influenced other collectors both inspiring them to collect tales and leading them to similarly believe in a spirit of romantic nationalism that the fairy tales of a country were particularly representative of it to the neglect of cross-cultural influence among those influenced were the Russian Alexander Afanasyev the Norwegians Peter Christen Asbjørnsen and Jørgen Moe the English Joseph Jacobs and Jeremiah Curtin and
