this is a fun and entertaining beginner level children s japanese language book 9 years old and up that is also appropriate for adults i m learning japanese takes a lighthearted approach to the japanese language by using fun anime style manga characters to teach japanese the book starts out with the main characters emily nico and teo sitting on the grass after school minding their own business when unbelievable a giant talking fox dressed in a kimono appears explaining that he knows

magic speaks many languages and is respected as a sensei master he wonders if the three kids are ready to learn japanese from him during the next 128 amusing pages the three friends learn to speak read and write japanese while also taking breaks to try japanese hot spring baths sumo wrestling zen meditation and more focusing on exactly what the 9 to 14 year old learner wants to know this book is carefully set up to allow them to learn japanese independently at their own speed without an adult's help though fun and lighthearted this book is incredibly practical as well an excellent learning resource whether you're 5 or 50 by the end students will master reading and writing the entire hiragana alphabet japanese sentence structure and 23 key kanji characters

this is a concise guide to learning beginner japanese and includes an accompanying audio cd this pocket book is intended for people who want to learn the basics of the japanese language quickly whenever you have a few minutes waiting in a hotel lobby riding on a train or whatever open this book and you can learn phrases you'll use again and again during your stay in japan the book is divided into twenty one chapters each covering a specific topic each chapter includes the following three sections words expressions this section introduces words and expressions needed in specific situations vocabulary is presented systematically for quick and easy understanding expressions in context this shows how to use in context the words and expressions given in the preceding section gives you confidence in using new words in original sentences additional words expressions this section enables you to create many new sentences using the patterns just learned there's no need to memorize all the words or phrases presented here concentrate on just those you want to use to use this book start by reading the first three chapters of the book these introduce many of the most commonly used words and phrases and familiarize you with the basic sentence structures after chapter 3 go straight to any chapter that interests you if you want to know what to say on the phone read chapter 14 if you have to take a train a few minutes with chapter 6 should enable you to reach your destination quickly and conveniently although this book contains over three hundred carefully selected words and expressions there is very little grammar included and there is no need for hours of rote memorization all that is required is a few minutes of your time

concise descriptions of grammar use and genres make learning japanese for real indispensable for adult learners of the language the volume presents a holistic view of the knowledge required for proficiency in japanese following introductory chapters on the language's background sound system and scripts word types and grammatical categories it introduces readers to simple then complex sentences a chapter on emotive expressions contains highly useful entries on attitudinal adverbs

exclamatory phrases interjections and rhetorical questions all of which carry emotive meanings learning japanese for real then goes beyond grammar to discuss how the language is used in interaction the author discusses communication strategies such as requesting apologizing and inviting as well how to interact when participating in a conversation with behaviors such as hand signals bowing and nodding she considers metaphor tautology puns and the lingering effect of yojoo before addressing the organization of japanese discourse including the four part organizational principle of ki shoo ten ketsu and the structure of staging the final sections feature authentic examples of popular culture discourse from manga television advertising magazines and cell phone novels and a host of practical suggestions methods tools resources for learning japanese learning japanese for real will become an key source for japanese language students during their elementary intermediate and advanced training as an essential anthology of grammar use and genres of the nihongo world teachers of japanese will also find it invaluable

my first japanese kanji book is an inventive and unique introduction to kanji for children written by the mother daughter team of eriko and anna sato this lovely book introduces 109 kanji characters to children with poems and illustrations it includes all the japanese government specified first grade level kanji characters and a sprinkling of simple second to sixth grade characters the kanji are introduced in the context of 36 colorful paintings and poems by 14 year old anna sato herself a kanji learner each of the poems is presented in both japanese and english and all kanji are accompanied by furigana small hiragana letters stroke order diagrams sample vocabulary and boxes for writing practice a charming and educational volume my first japanese kanji book can be used as a self study text a supplementary material in japanese language schools or a gift book for family or friends downloadable audio recordings reinforce learning and ensures correct pronunciation

complex issues surround second language acquisition and foreign language learning in any language there is no doubt that individuals are capable of acquiring two or more languages at different stages of human development particularly in childhood research investigating how adults acquire two languages also carries important insights into what takes place during later stages of human development from the fact that early and late bilinguals are faced with two languages in diverse stages of cognitive development we can predict differences in language processing between these two groups in the case of the japanese language unfortunately far fewer studies â particularly those written in english â have been presented on foreign language learners and bilingual children designed to address some of these gaps in the literature the chapters included in this book discuss various issues with regard to adult learners of japanese as an l2 and english japanese bilingual children this book

provides the reader with an overview of the field of Japanese linguistics and its current concerns. One of the main purposes of the book is to provide a forum in which to examine contributions in a variety of areas of Japanese linguistics to the teaching and learning of Japanese in the L2 classroom. This book has at least two interrelated areas of benefit: first, both researchers and teachers benefit from each other's expertise and receive new insights that apply to their respective fields; second, and more important, the book serves as a forum to promote ways in which we can apply linguistic theory to the learning of Japanese as an L2 that is what researchers have learned from both theory and practice can suggest what is important for the teaching of language; conversely, language educators have a great deal to offer linguists regarding the phenomenon of language. Thus, the goal of this book is to integrate theoretical concepts and empirical research findings in L2 development in order to apply them to educational practice.
