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the participatory cultures handbook will help students and scholars navigate this rapidly changing media and cultural terrain composed of newly commissioned essays from contributors across disciplines this handbook will introduce students to the concept of participatory culture explain how researchers approach participatory culture studies and provide original examples of participatory culture in action the wide range of topics explored in participatory culture include crowdsourcing citizen journalism fanfiction wikis video games video sharing transmedia storytelling and much more

as the standard reference in the field this edited handbook focuses on how a school psychologist can operate and create change within the educational system instead of focusing solely on the diagnosis and treatment of an individual chapters have been updated and revised to provide a contemporary view of the field

through a series of interviews with media practitioners including web developers programmers artists writers and producers this book examines the diversity of media it focuses upon the key concerns of practitioners and how they create their work and develop their projects and is useful for students of the media

in the last two decades both the conception and the practice of participatory culture have been transformed by the new affordances enabled by digital networked and mobile technologies this exciting new book explores that transformation by bringing together three leading figures in conversation jenkins ito and boyd examine the ways in which our personal and professional lives are shaped by experiences interacting with and around emerging media stressing the social and cultural contexts of participation the authors describe the process of diversification and mainstreaming that has transformed participatory culture they advocate a move beyond individualized personal expression and argue for an ethos of doing it together in addition to doing it yourself participatory culture in a networked era will interest students and scholars of digital media and their impact on society and will engage readers in a broader dialogue and conversation about their own participatory practices in this digital age

the topic feminist research has too often been neglected in standard research methods books the handbook of feminist research represents the establishment of a new tradition or paradigm in viewing how the research process is implemented feminist researchers bring unique epistemological and methodological perspectives to the research process feminists approach to methodology allows for new types of questions about women s lives and those of other ed marginalized groups to be addressed within their respective fields of research this handbook stresses the interconnections between epistemology methodology and methods they are not de linked from each other but work together in dynamic ways to produce new knowledge and this openness itself is also characteristic of how feminist researchers approach their work feminists engage synergistically with all three aspects of the research process epistemology methodology and method through a synergistic connection between these elements of research epistemology methodology and method we find that feminist research often shapes new research endeavors that are greater than the sum of their parts in other words while traditional research employs these components of research the synergistic engagement of these components in feminist research questions the status quo aiming to raise our consciousness about how we do research looking at the selections provided in this handbook we are able to look at feminist research its implementation of synergistic use of epistemology methodology and method and the resulting qualities of feminist research in practice

software art is a practice that regards software as a cultural phenomenon that defines one of the principal domains of our existence today thus software is not regarded as an invisible layer but rather as a decisive level and a language working at reproduction of certain orders whether aesthetic cultural social or political software art creatively questions and redefines software and its ways of functioning

this book is a collection of articles that reflect on various connectivities between art and social justice and media which are pertinent to studying contemporary societies how different forms of media and art in the broadest possible meaning of these terms reflect on relate to and campaign for social justice is an important topic to consider as artists academics and activists the subject matter of the book is also contextualized with attention being paid to historical cultural and communication factors and with chapters referencing situations and collaborations in brazil cyprus greece and south africa this is the first time that such a broad range of contexts are being considered together within the pursuit of studies on art and social justice furthermore this book concentrates on how different art forms are manifest in relation to social justice issues in an ever changing world mediated by the internet how much mobilization happens online through art and media and how much happens in a realityâ™ offline are issues explored at length with regard to youth and participation in social change
