today contemporary art is a global phenomenon biennales museums art fairs galleries auction houses academies and audiences for contemporary visual art are all institutions whose presence on a global scale has widened tremendously during the past two decades thus by including contemporary art from non western regions these traditional western art institutions have not only broadened their scope to a greater extent but have also been challenged themselves by the new cultural economic and media world order of globalization how contemporary art is made international is the subject of this book tracing as it does developments during the past two decades while focusing particularly on the mechanisms of globality which are at work in the art world today the book critically investigates fundamental questions like what is new internationalism in contemporary art and how it affected the art world how does new internationalism relate to concepts like ethnicity aesthetics standard art history and new media and how is new internationalism rather paradoxically furthered to a greater extent by global capitalism than it is by seemingly progressive art projects

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since the late 1990s contemporary art markets have emerged rapidly outside of europe and the united states china is the world's second largest art market in countries as diverse as brazil turkey and india modern and contemporary art has been recognized as a source of status or a potential investment tool among the new middle classes at art auctions in the us london and hong kong new buyers from emerging economies have driven up prices to record levels the result of these changes has been an increase in complexity interconnectedness stratification and differentiation of contemporary art markets our understanding of them is still in its early stages and empirical research in the field of globalization of high arts is still scarce this book brings together recent multidisciplinary cutting edge research on the globalization of art markets focusing on different regions including china russia india and japan as well as different institutions and organizations the chapters in this volume study the extent to which art markets indeed become global they show the various barriers to and the effects of globalization on the art market's organizational dynamics and the everyday narratives of people working within the art industry in doing so they recognize the coexistence of various ecologies of contemporary art exchange and sketch the presence of resilient local networks of actors and organizations some chapters show europe and the us continue to dominate especially when taking art market rankings and the most powerful events such as art basel into account however other chapters argue that things such as art fairs are truly global events and that the architecture of the art market which has originally been developed in europe and the us from the 19th century onwards is increasingly adopted across the world

concentrating on the shifting boundaries and definition of art richard kalina offers a panoramic view of the contemporary art scene over the last 30 years his focus is on the ongoing development of concepts the transformation of art worlds and the social matrices in which they are created discussing painting in general and abstract painting in particular his survey takes in photorealism sculpture and art forms found outside of the modernist tradition kalina's group of artists includes mel bochner joan mitchell cy twombly franz west and alma thomas who in their ongoing projects explicitly or implicitly questioned the aesthetic assumptions of their times merging an examination of animating philosophies and context political social and personal with a sharply focused look at the works of art themselves kalina brings us closer to understanding the social matrices in which art is embedded and responds to bigger questions about the object nature of the work of art in today's world

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in creative visions sociologist hannah wohl draws on more than one hundred interviews and two years of ethnographic research in the new york contemporary art market developing a sociological perspective on creativity through the analytic lens of judgment the artists she encountered range from those trying to land their first solo exhibition to those with several dozens of museum exhibitions she visited their studios and saw firsthand how they decided which works to leave unfinished or to destroy put into storage or exhibit she observed the installation of exhibitions in galleries assisted in selling artwork for a gallery and followed private collectors around art fairs and vip collector events moments of judgment whether by artists curators dealers or buyers led her to uncover that artistic practices are deeply sociological both because artists' decisions are informed by their interactions with others and because artists' decisions about their work affect the objects which circulate through the social world artists recognize that exhibitors and collectors prefer artists whom they deem to display a clear signature style wohl also explores judgment in art as part of the creative process evaluation she says is both a way that one judges how good a work is and how one makes decisions about producing work our understanding of creative work rests on these highly social dynamics wohl shows shedding new light on the production of cultural objects and prestige

this foundational anthology maps the emergence of a dynamic new global phenomenon contemporary asian art in 2008 asia stormed the citadel of the new york art world when two major museums presented retrospectives of asian contemporary artists cai guo qiang at the guggenheim museum and takashi murakami at the brooklyn museum meanwhile in hong kong a painting by zeng sanzhi sold for 9.5 million setting a new world auction record for chinese contemporary art the western art world is still coming to grips with the challenge it is all about asia now this book is the first anthology of critical writings to map the shift in both the nature and the reception of asian art over the past twenty years offering texts by leading figures in the field mostly asian and including more than fifty illustrations in color and black and white it covers developments in east asia including china korea and japan south asia including india and pakistan and southeast asia including vietnam

indonesia and thailand together the twenty three texts posit an historical and pan asian response to the question what is asian contemporary art considering such topics as asian modernism productive mistranslation of the european original asian cubism and the curating collecting and criticism of asian contemporary art this book promises to be a foundational reference for many years to come

everyone who looks at contemporary art is familiar with galleries but visual features of these mysterious temples tend to be taken for granted the basic purpose of this book is to enliven the reader s latent knowledge of galleries including architectural motifs the intended impression that is conveyed to the visitor and human interactions within them the contemporary art world system includes artists studios art galleries homes of collectors and public art museums to comprehend art one needs to understand these settings and how it travels through them the contemporary art gallery is a store where luxury goods are sold what distinguishes it from stores selling other luxuries upscale clothing jewelry and posh cars is the nature of the merchandise while much has been written about the art this book uncovers the secretive culture of the galleries themselves the gallery is the public site where art is first seen anyone can come and look for free this store a commercial site is where aesthetic judgments are made art s value is determined in this marketplace by the consensus formed by public opinion professional reviewers and sales the gallery then is the nexus of the enigmatic billion dollar art world and it is that space that is dissected here the first chapter briefly describes the beginnings of the present contemporary art gallery the second presents the experience of gallery going presenting summary accounts of visits to some contemporary galleries the third expands and extends that analysis with detailed close up descriptions and comparative evaluations of many diverse contemporary galleries in order to identify the challenges provided by these marvelous places then the fourth chapter indicates why in the near future due to the proliferation of myriad art fairs and online platforms extant today such galleries might disappear altogether
