international in scope this volume brings together leading and emerging voices working at the intersection of contemporary art visual culture activism and climate change and addresses key questions such as why and how do art and visual culture and their ethics and values matter with regard to a world increasingly shaped by climate breakdown foregrounding a decolonial and climate justice based approach this book joins efforts within the environmental humanities in seeking to widen considerations of climate change as it intersects with social political and cultural realms it simultaneously expands the nascent branches of ecocritical art history and visual culture and builds toward the advancement of a robust and critical interdisciplinarity appropriate to the complex entanglements of climate change this book will be of special interest to scholars and practitioners of contemporary art and visual culture environmental studies cultural geography and political ecology

a companion to contemporary art is a major survey covering the major works and movements the most important theoretical developments and the historical social political and aesthetic issues in contemporary art since 1945 primarily in the euro american context collects 27 original essays by expert scholars describing the current state of scholarship in art history and visual studies and pointing to future directions in the field contains dual chronological and thematic coverage of the major themes in the art of our time politics culture wars public space diaspora the artist identity politics the body and visual culture offers synthetic analysis as well as new approaches to debates central to the visual arts since 1945 such as those addressing formalism the avant garde the role of the artist technology and art and the society of the spectacle

from couture fashion to opulent perfumes and decadent food the luxury goods and services industry has grown at an unprecedented rate even in the context of a global recession but in contemporary digital culture does luxury still reside in material things or rather the look of things in this first study of luxury through the lens of visual culture armitage argues that luxury is undergoing a shift from material culture to the immaterial culture of the visual offering new forms of luxury engagement and

unparalleled levels of pleasure never before offered to the senses calling for a new understanding of luxury in the changing visual landscape of contemporary society luxury and visual culture embraces an extraordinary range of cultural forms including fashion photography social media television and art from the masterpieces of damien hirst and jeff koons to richard avedon s photography and louis vuitton s flagship stores the book explores key issues of globalization digitization consumer identity mass luxury and the role of art this text is ideal for all students of contemporary luxury studies as well as scholars and researchers in the field of visual culture

taking south asia as its focus this wide ranging collection probes the general reluctance of the cultural anthropology to engage with contemporary visual art and artists including painting sculpture performance art and installation through case studies engaged equally in anthropology and visual studies contributors examine art and artistic production in india sri lanka pakistan bangladesh and nepal to bring the social and political complexities of artistic practice to the fore demonstrating the potential of the visual as a means to understand a society its values and its politics this volume ranges across discourses of anthropology sociology biography memory art history and contemporary practices of visual art ultimately intersections of contemporary art anthropology and art history in south asia simultaneously expands and challenges the disciplinary foci of two fields it demonstrates to art criticism and art history the necessity of anthropological and sociological methodologies and theories while at the same time challenging the iconophobia of social sciences

taking on the myth of france s creative exhaustion following world war ii this collection of essays brings together an international team of scholars whose research offers english readers a rich and complex overview of the place of france and french artists in the visual arts since 1945 addressing a wide range of artistic practices spanning over seven decades and using different methodologies their contributions cover ground charted and unknown they introduce greater depth and specificity to familiar artists and movements such as lettrism situationist international or nouveau réalisme while bringing to the fore lesser known artists and groups including grapus the sociological art collective and nicolas schöffers collectively they stress the political dimensions and social ambitions of the art produced in france at the time deconstruct the traditional geography of the french art world and highlight the multiculturalism of the french art scene that resulted from its colonial past and the constant flux of artistic travels and migrations ultimately the book contributes to a story of postwar art in which france can be inscribed not as a main or sub chapter but rather as a vector in the wider constellation of modern and contemporary art

video art theory a comparative approach demonstrates how video art functions on the basis of a comparative media approach providing a crucial understanding of video as a medium in contemporary art and of the visual mediations we encounter in daily life a

the contemporary idea of the work of art is paradoxically both widely used and often unexamined therefore we must re evaluate the concept before we can understand what the deconstruction of aesthetics means for thinkers like jacques derrida jean luc nancy and philippe lacoue labarthe by examining their analyses of works of visual art and contextualizing their thinking on the matter martha heikkilä asserts that the implications of the work of art art and the aesthetic apply not only to philosophical questions but also to a broader area instead of the totality represented by the historical concept of art poststructuralist thinkers introduce the idea of the radical multiplicity of art and its works from this notion arises the fundamental issue in derrida and the poststructuralist tradition how can we speak philosophically of art which always exists as singular instances as works in deconstruction and the work of art visual arts and their critique in contemporary french thought heikkilä shows that the deconstructionist notions of art are still influential in the discourses of contemporary art in which artworks proliferate and the concept of work is open ended and expanding this book offers an introduction to the deconstructionist theory of art and brings new

perspectives to the complex undecidable relation between philosophy and art

many contemporary artists produce work that reflects nothing more than a perceived social reality it is the author s belief that postmodern art theory and education have trivialized the place of aesthetics in the visual arts despite the fact that humans search for meaning in life and experiencing the visual arts is one of the ways they seek such meaning humans according to the author s position understand the world about them in ways that do not easily conform to logical cognition alone they may also use intuition or pre thought in developing their understanding of the world and themselves intuitive thought in particular is inseparable to both artistic creation and appreciation as well as the concept of aesthetic experience it is a willingness to allow for the complexity of cognition that has been lost in postmodern theory and education one must re examine how humans have characteristically thought of art that is the

aesthetic tradition and use that understanding not only to broaden contemporary art theory and education but most importantly to aid individuals who seek aesthetic meaning in the visual arts

since the late 1990s contemporary art markets have emerged rapidly outside of europe and the united states china is r s lthe world s second largest art market in counties as diverse as brazil turkey and india modern and contemporary art has been recognized as a source of status or a potential investment tool among the new middle classes at art auctions in the us london and hong kong new buyers from emerging economies have driven up prices to record levels the result of these changes has been an increase in complexity interconnectedness stratification and differentiation of contemporary art markets our understanding of them is still in its early stages and empirical research in the field of globalization of high arts is still scarce this book brings together recent multidisciplinary cutting edge research on the globalization of art markets focusing on different regions including china russia india and japan as well as different institutions and organizations the chapters in this volume study the extent to which art markets indeed become global they show the various barriers to and the effects of globalization on the art market s organizational dynamics and the everyday narratives of people working within the art industry in doing so they recognize the coexistence of various ecologies of contemporary art exchange and sketch the presence of resilient local networks of actors and organizations some chapters show europe and the us continue to dominate especially when taking art market rankings and the most powerful events such as art basel into account however other chapters argue that things such as art fairs are truly global events and that the architecture of the art market which has originally been developed in europe and the us from the 19th century onwards is increasingly adopted across the world

today contemporary art is a global phenomenon biennales museums art fairs galleries auction houses academies and audiences for contemporary visual art are all institutions whose presence on a global scale has widened tremendously during the past two decades thus by including contemporary art from non western regions these traditional western art institutions have not only broadened their scope to a greater extent but have also been challenged themselves by the new cultural economic and media world order of globalization how contemporary art is made international is the subject of this book tracing as it does developments during the past two decades while focusing particularly on the mechanisms of globality which are at work in the art world today the book critically investigates fundamental questions like what is new internationalism in contemporary art and how it affected the art world how does new internationalism relate to concepts like ethnicity aesthetics standard art history and new media and how is new internationalism rather paradoxically furthered to a greater extent by global capitalism than it is by seemingly progressive art projects

researching and writing about contemporary art and artists present unique challenges for scholars students professional critics and creative practitioners alike this collection of essays from across the arts disciplines music literature dance theatre and the visual arts explores the challenges and complexities raised by engaging in researching and writing on living or recently deceased subjects and their output different sections explore critical perspectives and case studies in relation to innovative distinctive or otherwise leading work as well as offering innovative modes of discourse such as a visual essay and a music composition subjects addressed include recent scandals of canadian literary celebrity late career output the written element of music composition phds and the boundaries between ethnography and hagiography with case studies ranging from howard barker to adrian piper to sylvie guillem and misty copeland

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
