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this unique collection of essays originating in seminars held at SBL's annual and international meetings explores the current ethos and discipline of graduate biblical education from different social locations and academic contexts it includes international voices of well established scholars who have urged change for some time alongside younger scholars with new perspectives the individual contributions emerge from a variegated set of experiences in graduate biblical studies and a critical analysis of those experiences the volume is divided into four areas of investigation the first section discusses the ethos of biblical studies and social location and the second explores different cultural national formations of the discipline the third section considers the experiences and visions of graduate biblical studies while the last section explores how to transform the discipline all the contributions offer ways to transform graduate biblical education so that it becomes a socializing power that in turn can transform the present academic ethos of biblical studies back cover

originating as papers presented at the 4th scd learning and teaching theology conference the essays in this volume continue the discussion that began in the preceding volume wondering about god together scd press 2018 there the practice of research led learning and teaching was recognised to influence graduate outcomes and prompted the present discussion as to what kind of graduates were being produced the areas addressed in this volume provide a set of lenses through which an answer to this question might begin to emerge they include a discussion on what it might mean to move towards the forming of god s exemplary graduates reflections upon the biblical foundation of graduate character pedagogical principles for graduate development and a robust discussion on practical ways that teachers can engage in the classroom with graduate outcomes in mind the final section which brings the discussion to a fitting conclusion reflects on relevant implications for the successful pastoral graduate

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
