the history of the human world has reached a stage where no philosophical community can any longer philosophize in isolation from other philosophical communities the african philosophical community is not an exception and neither is any other philosophical community there is a widespread notion in the west that philosophy originated in greece and found its way throughout europe from where it migrated to africa this book argues that philosophy did not migrate to african from anywhere but that it is radically native to all communities the chapters cover the erasure of african philosophy african philosophy african legal philosophy african musical aesthetics and connections with classical philosophy arguing that the landscape of philosophy has a place not only for africans but also for all human beings and that african philosophers are among the architects of this landscape this book is an important read for scholars and students of african philosophy

throughout his career kant engaged with many of the fundamental questions in philosophy of religion arguments for the existence of god the soul the problem of evil and the relationship between moral belief and practice religion within the boundaries of mere reason is his major work on the subject this book offers a complete and internally cohesive interpretation of religion in contrast to more reductive interpretations as well as those that characterize religion as internally inconsistent lawrence r pasternack defends the rich philosophical theology contained in each of religion s four parts and shows how the doctrines of the pure rational system of religion are eminently compatible with the essential principles of transcendental idealism the book also presents and assesses the philosophical background to religion within the boundaries of mere reason the ideas and arguments of the text the continuing importance of kant s work to philosophy of religion today

this book utilizes philosophical tools to build up a framework for the classification analysis and assessment of political cinema the author first maps the category of political cinema clarifying what it means for a film to be political and then analyzes the relation between the value of a film as a political film and its value as art through philosophical enquiry angelo emanuele cioffi builds up a framework that could be of use in art critical practice and that can help with the classification and assessment of political films grounded in analytic philosophy of art and cognitivist film theory with insights from political science political philosophy epistemology and cognitive science the book presents a unique analysis of the relation between films and the political this theory is tested with detailed case studies and the author uses specific films as examples of the applicability and explanatory power of this theoretical framework as such this book will be of interest not just to film studies film theory and political philosophy scholars but to anyone with an interest in political film aesthetic practice and philosophy of art

adulyadej king rama ix of thailand an accomplished jazz musician to the balinese notion of taksu a form of supreme energy and divine power crucial for compelling performances in the performing arts we venture into the islamic and the middle eastern world in section iv where the dance practices of the hadhrami arabs in the malay archipelago to traditional sharah music are contextualized within islamic philosophy this section also describes the philosophical ideas of the 12th century persian philosopher and founder of the illuminationist ishraq philosophy shihab al din al suhrawardi arguing that his ideas have much to recommend music education as this approach requires students to listen in deeper ways absorb more abundantly and move beyond arts education to encompass the education of the whole person section v concludes with a metaphorical view on a new silk road in music education in the 21st century where ideas are traded for mutual benefit and the development multicultural philosophies of music education while there are numerous publications on the philosophy of music education rooted in the western philosophical traditions of ancient greece the asian philosophical voice is virtually silent outside of asia and this volume aims to begin the long process of redressing this imbalance this volume will open readers to the richness of asian philosophical sources and hopefully stimulate dialogues that could generate new insights and directions for further development cross pollination and application of some of the world searliest philosophical traditions

traversing philosophical boundaries is the most comprehensive multicultural text reader for introductory philosophy addressing six primary philosophical concerns the self reality epistemology ethics politics and religion this book contains not only many readings from the western canon but essential readings from many cultural perspectives not typically included in introductory philosophy classes as well asian african african american latin american and feminist traditions are broadly represented and fully integrated into the exploration of these fundamental matters

karl jaspers who died in 1969 had a profound impact on 20th century theology and philosophy his central thesis called for among other things a de centering of philosophy from its eurocentric roots and a renewal of its dialogue with other traditions especially asian ones this collection of essays includes unpublished work by jaspers himself as well as testimonies to his life and career by colleagues associates and translators some of who knew jaspers personally readers will also find commentary and interpretation by researchers who have explored jaspers work for decades and a biographical account of jaspers student leonard ehrlich who handled much of jaspers english translation the book interrogates jaspers conceptions of philosophical faith his philosophy of communication and the prospects for world philosophy in the future focusing on philosophical faith it assesses jaspers interpretations of key philosophers such as kant hegel schelling kierkegaard nietzsche and rosenzweig as well as examining his personal relationships with bultmann and heidegger contributors also look at jaspers philosophies of religion and history his hypothesis of the axial age achsenzeit and his contributions to metaphysics periechontology and economics finally chapters cover jaspers philosophy of communication and world history the latter are informed by a burgeoning interest in kantian freiheitphilosophie that influenced jaspers as well as concerns over the future of humanity these concerns in part account for jaspers growing popularity in the middle east eastern europe central south america and asia also included are lucid clarifications of the difference between religious and philosophical faith and the relevance ofcertainty trust and communication for a future of mankind trained as a psychiatrist jaspers practiced this profession before becoming a philosopher and thus had a keen insight into the workings of the human mind even as he challenged the philosophical establishment of his time it is perhaps this depth to his background tha

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same as ten 80 000 word works with the king james old and new testament totaling just over 783 000 words it is easy to see why michael views himself as both prolific plentiful and loquacious talkative when it pertains to laying down thought as the bible is for millions on the planet michael feels his principles are also a template an owner s manual a guidebook for in particular how to 1 view life on earth 2 work on the detail of one s philosophy and worldview and 3 examine and conduct a balanced meaningful existence on this planet the holy bible consists of 80 books 39 in the old hebrew part 14 in the apocrypha and 27 in the new christian part michael s principles volumes one and two each cover 84 chapters of the basic areas of life as he views them with 21 chapters outlined each for 1 the mental 3 the social and 2 the material 4 the spiritual areas of our lives a detailed numbering system is in place for quick reference to topics each volume happens to come in at 613 entries making a total of 1226 separate entries in the two books by dictionary definition a principle is defined as a fundamental truth or proposition that serves as the foundation for a system of belief or behavior or for a chain of reasoning this is precisely why he chose principles in the title his own personal philosophical principles are what he tries to practice daily michael even states they are likely the reason he is still with us in bodily form on the earth and remains in relative possession of his right mind as well since leaving organized religion early on in life these tenants practiced in balance have been what michael has focused on for several decades they work well for him in the course of these pursuits he says he has come to thousands of conclusions and they all point to the balanced life as he insists for him it is all about equivalent portions of mind mental body material relationships social and spirituality god the universe basically everything can be summed up within these four primary areas of life michael seems to never h
