twenty thousand leagues under the seas a world tour underwater french vingt mille lieues sous les mers tour du monde sous marin is a classic science fiction adventure novel by french writer jules verne the novel was originally serialized from march 1869 through june 1870 in pierre jules hetzel's fortnightly periodical the magasin d'éducation et de récréation a deluxe octavo edition published by hetzel in november 1871 included 111 illustrations by alphonse de neuville and Édouard riou 1 the book was widely acclaimed on its release and remains so it's regarded as one of the premiere adventure novels and one of verne's greatest works along with around the

world in eighty days and journey to the center of the earth its depiction of captain nemo s underwater ship the nautilus is regarded as ahead of its time since it accurately describes many features of today s submarines which in the 1860s were comparatively primitive vessels a model of the french submarine plongeur launched in 1863 figured at the 1867 exposition universelle where jules verne examined it 2 and was inspired by it 3 4 when penning his novel 5 an american frigate tracking down a ship sinking monster faces not a living creature but an incredible invention a fantastic submarine commanded by the mysterious captain nemo suddenly a devastating explosion leaves just three survivors who find themselves prisoners inside nemo s death ship on an underwater odyssey around the world from the pearl laden waters of ceylon to the icy dangers of the south pole as captain nemo one of the greatest villians ever created takes his revenge on all society more than a marvelously thrilling drama this classic novel written in 1870 foretells with uncanny accuracy the inventions and advanced technology of the twentieth century and has become a literary stepping stone for generations of science fiction writers

a mysterious beast is attacking ships the world over the famous oceanographer pierre aronnax thinks that the beast is a gargantuan narwhale you know a marine animal with a freaking sword on its head no big deal so aronnax is invited on a special mission by the u s secretary of the navy to board the uss abraham lincoln and begin hunting for this sea creature after weeks of searching the ship finally encounters the beast but it s simply no match for it aronnax is thrown overboard when the monster rams the ship which leads his servant conseil to go in after him the two struggle to get back onboard the lincoln only to end up on the deck of some other vessel all is not well on the new ship a bunch of men throw aronnax conseil and ned land a canadian harpooner into a cell below deck soon after they are visited by their crazy cap n who reveals that he can speak all of the languages that they speak french german english and latin even though he pretended not to at first weirdo so we know very little about this guy who calls himself captain nemo but he says already knows who aronnax and his men are which is super creepy considering this whole story takes place in those pre facebook days how did he know anyway nemo tells the guys that he has broken with humanity and lives a secret life under the sea spiffy huh not really nemo s break with normal people means that our three main dudes can never go back on land nemo says they ll have freedom onboard his vessel the nautilus except for the fact that he might lock them up again at any time which doesn t sound much like freedom to us

twenty thousand leagues under the sea a tour of the underwater world during the year 1866 ships of several nations spot a mysterious sea monster which some suggest to be a giant narwhal the united states government assembles an expedition in new york city to find and destroy the monster professor pierre aronnax a french

marine biologist and narrator of the story who happens to be in new york at the time receives a last minute invitation to join the expedition which he accepts canadian whaler and master harpoonist ned land and aronnax s faithful servant conseil are also brought aboard the expedition departs brooklyn aboard the united states navy frigate abraham lincoln and travels south around cape horn into the pacific ocean after a long search the ship finds the monster and then attacks the beast which damages the ship s rudder the three protagonists are then hurled into the water and grasp hold of the hide of the creature which they find to their surprise to be a submarine very far ahead of its era they are quickly captured and brought inside the vessel where they meet its enigmatic creator and commander captain nemo the rest of the story follows the adventures of the protagonists aboard the creature the submarine the nautilus which was built in secrecy and now roams the seas free from any land based government captain nemo s motivation is implied to be both a scientific thirst for knowledge and a desire for revenge upon and self imposed exile from civilization nemo explains that his submarine is electrically powered and can perform advanced marine biology research he also tells his new passengers that although he appreciates conversing with such an expert as aronnax maintaining the secrecy of his existence requires never letting them leave aronnax and conseil are enthralled by the undersea adventures but ned land can only think of escape they visit many places under the ocean some real world and others fictional the travelers witness the real corals of the red sea the wrecks of the battle of vigo bay the antarctic ice shelves the transatlantic telegraph cable and the legendary submerged land of atlantis the travelers also use diving suits to hunt sharks and other marine life with air guns and have an underwater funeral for a crew member who died when an accident occurred under mysterious conditions inside the nautilus when the nautilus returns to the atlantic ocean a pack of poulpes usually translated as a giant squid although in french poulpe means octopus attacks the vessel and kills a crew member throughout the story captain nemo is suggested to have exiled himself from the world after an encounter with the forces that occupied his country that had devastating effects on his family not long after the incident of the poulpes nemo suddenly changes his behavior toward aronnax avoiding him aronnax no longer feels the same and begins to sympathize with ned land near the end of the book the nautilus is attacked by a warship of some nation that had made nemo suffer filled with hatred and revenge nemo ignores aronnax s pleas for mercy nemo nicknamed angel of hatred by aronnax destroys the ship ramming it just below the waterline and consequently sinking it into the bottom of the sea much to aronnax s horror as he watches the ship plunge into the abyss nemo bows before the pictures of his wife and children and

collaboration with the publisher pierre jules hetzel led to the creation of the voyages extraordinaires a widely popular series of scrupulously researched adventure novels including journey to the center of the earth 1864 twenty thousand leagues under the sea 1870 and around the world in eighty days 1873

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perhaps we saw the 1950 s movie with kirk douglas or maybe we had the snot scared out of us on the disney world ride as kids regardless 20 000 leagues under the sea is indelibly etched into the collective memory the original by jules verne was published in 1869 when submarines were in their infancy once again verne predicts much of what will come technologically the crew of an american ship sets off to investigate a giant sea monster only to find it fight it and then realize it s a submarine it s called the nautilus and was built by the mysterious captain nemo fortunately he lets the multinational crew live long enough to go exploring with him until like many mad scientist types he gets bored of his quarry and goes a bit nuts one last thing don t let the name 20 000 leagues under the sea fool you 20k leagues is over two and a half times the circumference of the earth the title refers to the total distance they traveled 20 000 leagues enjoy
