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thanks to the advances in modern science we have an ever increasing appreciation of just what an amazing creation our universe is even the knowledge that scientists and doctors continue to gather about our bodies stagger our imaginations we see miracles repeated so many times that we take them for granted the changes of the seasons rain from clouds the growth of flowers and trees and the soil s production of all kinds of fruit we look around us and see the fantastic abundance of animate and inanimate life animals geological features water fish stars and so on

period of the first temple yet embraced it in the second temple period 534 b c e 70 c e and why christianity placed the afterlife in the center of its belief system he discusses the inner dialogues and arguments within judaism and christianity showing the underlying dynamic behind them as well as the ideas that mark the differences between the two religions in a thoughtful examination of the influence of biblical views of heaven and martyrdom on islamic beliefs he offers a fascinating perspective on the current troubling rise of islamic fundamentalism in tracing the organic historical relationships between sacred texts and communities of belief and comparing the visions of life after death that have emerged throughout history segal sheds a bright revealing light on the intimate connections between notions of the afterlife the societies that produced them and the individual s search for the ultimate meaning of life on earth

suppose you knew that though you yourself would live your life to its natural end the earth and all its inhabitants would be destroyed thirty days after your death to what extent would you remain committed to your current projects and plans would scientists still search for a cure for cancer would couples still want children in death and the afterlife philosopher samuel scheffler poses this thought experiment in order to show that the continued life of the human race after our deaths the afterlife of the title matters to us to an astonishing and previously neglected degree indeed scheffler shows that in certain important respects the future existence of people who are as yet unborn matters more to us than our own continued existence and the continued existence of those we love without the expectation that humanity has a future many of the things that now matter to us would cease to do so by contrast the prospect of our own deaths does little to undermine our confidence in the value of our activities despite the terror we may feel when contemplating our deaths the prospect of humanity s imminent extinction would pose a far greater threat to our ability to lead lives

of wholehearted engagement scheffler further demonstrates that although we are not unreasonable to fear death personal immortality like the imminent extinction of humanity would also undermine our confidence in the values we hold dear his arresting conclusion is that in order for us to lead value laden lives what is necessary is that we ourselves should die and that others should live death and the afterlife concludes with commentary by four distinguished philosophers harry frankfurt niko kolodny seana shiffrin and susan wolf who discuss scheffler s ideas with insight and imagination scheffler adds a final reply

there is no systematic theology in the new testament regarding death and afterlife therefore the appropriate question as it turns out is not what does the new testament say about death and afterlife but what do various new testament texts say about it she explores anthropology cosmology eschatology and where relevant theology and christology

a new york times bestselling historian of early christianity takes on two of the most gripping questions of human existence where did the ideas of heaven and hell come from and why do they endure what happens when we die a recent pew research poll showed that 72 of americans believe in a literal heaven 58 in a literal hell most people who hold these beliefs are christian and assume they are the age old teachings of the bible but eternal rewards and punishments are found nowhere in the old testament and are not what jesus or his disciples taught so where did the ideas come from in clear and compelling terms bart ehrman recounts the long history of the afterlife ranging from the epic of gilgamesh up to the writings of augustine focusing especially on the teachings of jesus and his early followers he discusses ancient guided tours of heaven and hell in which a living person observes the sublime blessings of heaven for those who are saved and the horrifying torments of hell for the damned some of these accounts take the form of near death experiences the oldest on record with intriguing similarities to those reported today one of ehrman s startling conclusions is

that there never was a single greek jewish or christian understanding of the afterlife but numerous competing views moreover these views did not come from nowhere they were intimately connected with the social cultural and historical worlds out of which they emerged only later in the early christian centuries did they develop into the notions of eternal bliss or damnation widely accepted today as a historian ehrman obviously cannot provide a definitive answer to the question of what happens after death in heaven and hell he does the next best thing by helping us reflect on where our ideas of the afterlife come from he assures us that even if there may be something to hope for when we die there is certainly nothing to fear

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
