begins with an in depth history of the tactical urbanism movement and its place among other social political and urban planning trends with a detailed set of case studies that demonstrate the breadth and scalability of tactical urbanism interventions this book provides a detailed toolkit for conceiving planning and carrying out projects

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temporary and tactical urbanism examines a key set of urban design strategies that have emerged in the twenty first century such projects range from guerrilla gardens and bike lanes to more formalised temporary beaches and swimming pools parklets pop up plazas and buildings and container towns these practices enable diverse forms of economic social and artistic life that are usually repressed by the fixities of urban form and its management this book takes a thematic approach to explore what the scope of this practice is and understand why it has risen to prominence how it works who is involved and what its implications are for the future of city design and planning it critically examines the material social economic and political complexities that surround and enable these small ephemeral urban interventions it identifies their short term and long term implications for urban intensity diversity creativity and adaptability the book s insights into temporary and tactical urbanism have particular relevance in the context of the covid 19 pandemic which has highlighted both the need and the possibility of quickly transforming urban spaces worldwide they also reveal significant lessons for the long term planning and design of buildings landscapes and cities

this book advances the reflexion into how temporary urbanism is shaping cities across the world temporary urbanism has become a core concept in urban development and its application is increasingly crossing the borders of both the north and the global south there is a need to reflect upon the diverse ways of understanding and implementing the temporary in the production of space internationally and discuss what this means for both research and practice divided into two sections the book compiles and reflects upon the

various attempts to reframe and reconceptualise temporary urbanism the first section focuses on reframing and reconceptualising temporary urbanisms it develops the argument that temporary urbanism allows a reinterrogation of the role of temporalities and non permanence into the place making process and hence in the production and reproduction of cities including the adaptability of existing spaces and production of new spaces while drawing upon different theoretical and conceptual framings permeability assemblage rhythms waiting authors bring insights from various case studies the dublin biennial ireland temporary uses in geneva switzerland temporary urban settlements in sub saharan africa refugees camp in beirut lebanon and political protests in skopje republic of macedonia the second section looks at unwrapping the complexity and diversity of temporary urbanisms it aims at securing a better understanding of the complexity and diversity of temporary urbanism including a dialogue between various experiences both in the global north and in the global south it looks at the implications of temporary urbanism in the delivery of planning and considers how and by whom cities are governed and transformed again a range of examples are mobilised by contributors spanning from temporary uses and projects in london uk santiago chile paris france vancouver canada barcelona spain budapest hungary beijing china sao paulo brazil and milwaukee usa this book will be of interests to all researchers practitioners and students who want to gain a more thorough understanding of the topic of temporary urbanism compare its diversity and similarities across different contexts and reflect on the wider implications of temporary urbanisms for urban transformations

public space in order to develop means of transport that are both efficient and adapted to the health context and their effects on cycling practices in europe north and south america its contributors collectively reveal and evidence through policies analysis mapping and innovative qualitative analysis bridging video and interviews how those new infrastructures and policies can be a trigger for change in a context of mobility transition this book provides an important element on the way local authorities can act in a quicker and more agile way while some decisions are specific to the context of the beginning of the pandemic the analysis offers lessons on the way to implement the transition toward a low carbon mobility on the importance of processes based on trials and errors on the political stakes of reallocating road space

the social re production of architecture brings the debates of the right to the city into today s context of ecological economic and social crises building on the 1970s discussions about the production of space which french sociologist henri lefebvre considered a civic right the authors question who has the right to make space and explore the kinds of relations that are produced in the process in the emerging post capitalist era this book addresses urgent social and ecological imperatives for change and opens up questions around architecture s engagement with new forms of organization and practice the book asks what new kinds of social can architecture re produce and what kinds of politics values and actions are needed the book features 24 interdisciplinary essays written by leading theorists and practitioners including social thinkers economic theorists architects educators urban curators feminists artists and activists from different generations and global contexts the essays discuss the diverse global locations with work taking different and specific forms in these different contexts a cutting edge critical text which rethinks both practice and theory in the light of recent crises making it key reading for students academics and practitioners

cities are typically thought of as permanent structures streets infrastructure and other features of the built environment even if they are periodically replaced are intended to endure but temporary flexible spaces and uses are essential to how cities function and the ways urban dwellers inhabit them such adaptability moreover is fundamental if cities are to meet the challenges of the future this book examines temporary urbanisms across varied global contexts considering their significance for cities and everyday life as well as for policy and practice it brings together many distinct forms and facets of temporariness and adaptability from sites of consumption by privileged residents to the survival strategies of marginalized groups drawing on examples spanning five continents lauren andres explores the driving forces of adaptability as well as the power dynamics and tensions between temporariness and permanence she highlights how adaptability enhances livability sustainability and resilience showing its importance for addressing crises such as climate change socioeconomic inequalities and pandemics authoritative and wide ranging adaptable cities and temporary urbanisms reveals why experimentation and creativity are crucial to the present and future of cities

new modes of practice are now emerging in architecture rural studio exyzt muf assemble and many more have led the way by challenging conventional ideas of the architect and reclaiming the notion of architecture as something public that should work ultimately towards the collective good this quiet revolution is born out of a crisis in the profession and a wider vacuum in the political environmental and economic situation on the one hand architecture as a profession has seen its influence diminish rapidly over the last 50 years through privatisation and the dominance of finance while on the other hand it has also lacked collective courage and readiness to evolve without necessarily being aware of each other studios around the world are now redefining the profession of architecture as something more proactive self aware and political they are broadening their skill sets and becoming deeply involved in their projects initiating them themselves financing them and running them though much of this work is dealing with local issues at a relatively small scale it is inherently ambitious with global application contributors include shumi bose indy johar alison killing douglas murphy and finn williams featured architects atelier d architecture autoglr the aaa adamo faiden baupiloten grupo toma hector inteligencias colectivas raumlaborberlin studiobasar studio gutgut taller ken and we made that

in reframing the reclaiming of urban space a feminist exploration into do it yourself urbanism in chicago megan e heim lafrombois explores the concept of do it yourself diy urbanism from an intersectional feminist analytical framework interventions based on diy urbanism are small scale and place specific and focus on urban spaces which can be reclaimed and repurposed often outside of formal urban planning institutions heim lafrombois examines the discourses and processes surrounding the institutionalized and embedded nature of diy urbanism she weaves together sites and sources to reveal the ways in which diy

urbanists make sense of their participation and experiences with diy urbanism and with the broader political social and economic contexts and spaces in which these activities take place her research findings contribute to and build on current research that illustrates the importance of gender race class and sexuality to cities local politics urban planning initiatives and the development of communities

how will climate change affect our lives where will its impacts be most deeply felt are we doing enough to protect ourselves from the coming chaos in extreme cities ashley dawson argues that cities are ground zero for climate change contributing the lion s share of carbon to the atmosphere while also lying on the frontlines of rising sea levels today the majority of the world s megacities are located in coastal zones yet few of them are adequately prepared for the floods that will increasingly menace their shores instead most continue to develop luxury waterfront condos for the elite and industrial facilities for corporations these not only intensify carbon emissions but also place coastal residents at greater risk when water levels rise in extreme cities dawson offers an alarming portrait of the future of our cities describing the efforts of staten island new york and shishmareff alaska residents to relocate holland s models for defending against the seas and the development of new york city before and after hurricane sandy our best hope lies not with fortified sea walls he argues rather it lies with urban movements already fighting to remake our cities in a more just and equitable way as much a harrowing study as a call to arms extreme cities is a necessary read for anyone concerned with the threat of global warming and of the cities of the world
