there is growing consensus in states across the nation that the goal of the k 12 education system is to prepare all students to graduate from high school ready for college and careers yet in all but a handful of states the priority goals set to drive student performance toward and beyond college and career readiness sputter out after the word college the student performance indicators that states include in school and district level report cards and accountability systems should tell a story

about what matters most to the states looking at these report cards and accountability systems the story seems to be that the essential and in college and careers is actually an or with the focus on career readiness often limited to a subset of students the purpose of this brief is to increase knowledge and understanding of career readiness by proposing an expanded framework for college and career ready indicators that better incorporates indicators focused on career preparation the authors intend to catalyze action they provide guidance and recommendations for states on how they can take steps in the next few years to ensure that the career in their college and career ready accountability and public reporting system is not an afterthought but rather a powerful lever to focus priorities drive progress and ultimately see more students and their communities succeed importantly the authors are not putting forward one specific approach or strategy for valuing college and career readiness but rather offering a view into how states are currently approaching this challenge and what policymakers need to consider as they look to reform their own reporting and accountability systems a glossary is included

this book disrupts the false dichotomy of college versus career by showing how young people and the programs created to serve them integrate the worlds of college and career readiness as students work to learn against the odds and strive toward lives that matter to them work based learning at each stage of the k college experience is crucial to the development of young people through analysis of national policies on college readiness and work based learning as well as through illustrative case studies of young people in work based learning programs the authors highlight the programs voices and experiences of young people from middle school through college through interviews participating students share their views aspirations and preparation for both college and career

students with special needs are a unique subgroup of students who have challenges that most students do not encounter they require additional support from teachers administrators and policies in order to be successful at school this study intends to determine the ways that general and special education teachers incorporate college and career readiness into their curriculum at private name high school a case study was employed as a means to gather qualitative data the results from an in depth survey were coded using intercoder reliability this study revealed that the majority of teachers at private name high school are incorporating college and career readiness strategies and skills in their classroom curriculum but there is room for improvement in transitional knowledge and skills
