in this book i pursue three goals the first is to describe what has been learned about human freedom through psychological research the second is to provide a conceptual and methodological critique of the large body of that research which has been conducted within the framework of a positivist natural science ex perimental social psychology my third goal is to offer a contrasting human science approach to the study of human freedom and to illustrate its use in empirical study for more than twenty years psychologists have inves tigated the conditions under which people are seen to be free the conditions under which they report feeling free the psychological consequences of interference with be havioural

freedoms and to a lesser extent how it feels to feel free empirical findings on each of these facets of human freedom have arisen in quite separate research traditions and they are brought together here for the first time during the same twenty years a general critique of the dominant positivist natural science approach to complex human phenomena has been growing although it has escalated recently this critique has firm roots that go back to the turn of the century i review this general critique and apply it specifically to the study of human freedom surely a complex human phenomenon more complex ambiguous and paradoxical than most of us imagine

between 1975 and 1997 some three million vietnamese cambodians and laotians fled atrocities in their home countries with over 210 000 resettling in canada while this history is partly known to some canadians little has been written about it especially from the perspectives of the refugees themselves hearts of freedom is a rich oral history based on interviews with 145 former refugees sharing deeply moving accounts of oppression concentration camps genocide and perilous escapes over land and sea survivors reflect on their first impressions of canada the unfamiliar snow and cold the unexpected kindness of neighbours and occasional encounters with racism through their experiences we come to understand the strengths and weaknesses of canada s refugee programs these stories reveal how refugees attachment to canada grew over the years and how multiculturalism policies facilitated that ordinary canadians played a decisive role in the first mass refugee movement through newly created private sponsorship programs a role for which the united nations awarded the nansen medal to the canadian people in 1986 coming at a time when we are assessing the benefits of immigration and refugee policies and programs hearts of freedom documents the lives and contributions of people who have suffered the worst excesses of war to rebuild their lives in canada

aung san suu kyi spoke passionately about non violence she wrote involved articles about compatibility of democracy with buddhism and she won the hearts and minds of so many with her call for the freedom from fear it seemed for more than two decades that suu kyi was a perfect non western propagator of democracy human rights rule of law yet a deeper analysis reveals that suu kyi intellectually indeed has been a democrat all along but a burmese democrat suu kyi understands democracy in a buddhist way and she reasons about politics using buddhist ideas idioms and concepts this buddhist dominance of her political thought had several consequences the most important one being that her approach to
