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william cobbett was an english journalist and member of parliament who was born in farnham surrey he believed that reforming parliament and abolishing the rotten boroughs would help to end the poverty of farm labourers and he attacked the borough mongers sinecurists and tax eaters relentlessly through the seeming contradictions in cobbett s life his opposition to authority stayed constant he wrote many polemics on subjects from political reform to religion this is volume two out of four of his most essential writings covering the years 1805 to 1809

the oxford history of life writing volume 2 early modern explores life writing in england between 1500 and 1700 and argues that this was a period which saw remarkable innovations in biography autobiography and diary keeping that laid the foundations for our modern life writing the challenges wrought by the upheavals and the sixteenth century english reformation and seventeenth century civil wars moulded british and early american life writing in unique and lasting ways while classical and medieval models continued to exercise considerable influence new forms began to challenge them the english reformation banished the saints lives that dominated the writings of medieval catholicism only to replace them with new lives of protestant martyrs novel forms of self accounting came into existence from the daily moral self accounting dictated by strands of calvinism to the daily financial self accounting modelled on the new double entry book keeping this volume shows how the most ostensibly private journals were circulated to build godly communities how women found new modes of recording and understanding their disrupted lives how men started to compartmentalize their lives for public and private consumption the volume doesn't intend to present a strict chronological progression from the medieval to the modern nor to suggest the triumphant rise of the fact based historical biography instead it portrays early modern england as a site of multiple sometimes conflicting possibilities for life writing all of which have something to teach us about how the period understood both the concept of a life and what it mean to write a life

in the final years of the weimar republic benjamin emerged as the most original public intellectual in the german speaking world here benjamin is represented by two of his greatest literary essays surrealism and on the image of proust as well as by an article on goethe and a selection of his wide ranging commentary for german newspapers

roman jakobson's writings range over the entire field of general linguistics as well as embracing slavic linguistics and literature theory jakobson has had a tremendous influence on the development of linguistic theory he was a founder of and prime mover in the prague linguistic circle on the basis of the new structuralist concepts he set forth bold theories of general linguistics and illustrated them with brilliant demonstrations based on slavic and other languages taking a leading

role in the elucidation of the structural linguistic field of phonology jakobson used these insights to develop new trends in historical phonology altogether his linguistics appears to incorporate the technical design of modern theoretical concepts but at the same time transcends purely formal modeling through its interdisciplinary focus upon historical and poetic matters jakobson was enormously successful in presenting innovative theoretical insights and relating them to possible practical applications specifically his work on the general processes of language acquisition and loss on child language and aphasia opened up entirely new methods for linguists and doctors alike the series selected writings represents the whole range of roman jakobson s field of research

new black and african writing vol 2 is our concluding edition of a series that has featured many critical entries and reviews on canonical african fiction poetry drama and non fiction this second edition explores intricacies of relationships and associations the recurrent tropes for the interpretation and understanding of historical connections and the shaping of thought brought into fictional and cultural renditions that are evolving and continually reassessed although around the periphery of older canons the quest for a meaningful heuristic for approaching contemporary arts is almost totally redefined by the contributions of eminent scholars of our time whose balancing and correspondence create room for complementarity of values and toward cultural understanding and value appreciation in contemporary society

walter benjamin s antifascist education is the first comprehensive analysis of educational themes across the entirety of the critical theorist s diverse writings starting with benjamin s early reflections on teaching and learning tyson e lewis argues that the aesthetic and cultural forms to which benjamin so often turned namely radio broadcasts children s theatrical productions collections cityscapes public cinemas and word games swell with educational potentialities what emerges from lewis s reading is a constellational curriculum composed of minor practices such as poor teaching absentminded learning and nondurational studying this curriculum carries political significance offering an antidote to past and present forms of fascist manipulation hardness and coldness walter benjamin s antifascist education is a testimony to benjamin s belief that everyone is an educator and everyone needs to be educated and everything is education

to this day there persists a widespread assumption that adorno s references to marx and especially to marx s critique of political economy represent a relic from an early and short lived stage of adorno s theoretical development on the basis of relevant and largely unpublished textual sources this book refutes this thesis while showing that the centre of adorno s critical theory of society is occupied by a critique not only of political economy but of economy in general

this volume serves as a companion to early psychological research contributions from women of color volume i it focuses on the dissertations of 20 builders women of color who earned their doctoral degrees in psychology prior to 1990 and who were leaders in the field through their leadership or innovation an introductory chapter bridges the two volumes each subsequent chapter summarizes and examines a dissertation using a consistent format including a biographical sketch of the builder with

an emphasis on her significant contribution to an organization or innovation that moved the field forward a summary of the dissertation a reproducibility critique of the dissertation and an alternative framework section that analyzes the dissertation from a modern theoretical perspective or methodological approach e g feminist theory liberation psychology mestiza consciousness etc the topics cover the breadth of the discipline of psychology including physiological cognitive developmental social and clinical some topics are also relevant to business education medicine and social work the varying nature of these dissertations allows the book to be used to augment coursework either as a complete collection or as individual chapters this volume is intended for both instructors and students the course activities provide examples of how to integrate key aspects of the dissertation research into the classroom the volume was written with upper level undergraduate students in mind so that it could be used across the psychology curriculum but the editors envision this book as a potential graduate level text as well

overcoming the war of religion between analytics and continentals with a brand new metaphysical insight graham harman has restored to philosophy its greatness and value maurizio ferraris italian continental philosopher and author of the manifesto of new realism the graham harman reader is the essential compendium of shorter works by one of the most influential philosophers of the twenty first century the writings in this volume are split into seven chapters the first concerns harman s resistance to both downward and upward reductionism the second chapter contains works that develop the specific fourfold structure of object oriented ontology in the third we find harman s novel arguments for why causal relations between two entities can only be indirect the fourth chapter discusses why aesthetics deserves to be called first philosophy the fifth chapter contains harman s underrated contributions to ethics and politics and the sixth deals with epistemology mind and science a concluding seventh chapter contains several previously unpublished writings not available anywhere else written in harman s typical clear and witty style the reader is an essential resource for veteran readers of harman and newcomers alike

ideas gain legitimacy as they are put to some practical use a study of charles sanders peirce 1839 1914 supports this pragmatism as a way of thinking about truth and meaning architecture has a strong pragmatic strand not least as we think of building users architecture as a practice the practical demands of building and utility after all vitruvius placed firmness and delight in the company of utilitas amongst his demands on architecture peirce pronounced peirce was a logician and so many of his ideas are couched in terms of formal propositions and their limitations his work appeals therefore to many architects grappling with the digital age and references to his work cropped up in the design methods movement that developed and grew from the 1950s that movement sought to systematise the design process contributing to the idea of the riba plan of work computer aided design and various controversies about rendering the design process transparent and open to scrutiny peirce s commitment to logic led him to investigate the basic elements of logical statements notably the element of the sign his best known contribution to design revolves around his intricate theory of semiotics the science of signs the study of semiotics divided around the 1980s between advocates of peirce s semiotics and the broader more politically charged field of structuralism the latter has held sway in architectural discourse since the 1980s why this happened and what we gain by

reviving a peircean semiotics is the task of this book

complicating the standard interpretation of habermas as a proceduralist mimesis and reason uncovers the role that mimesis or imitation plays as a genuinely political force in communicative action through a penetrating examination of habermas s use of themes and concepts from plato george herbert mead and walter benjamin gregg daniel miller reconstructs habermas s theory to reveal a new postmetaphysical articulation of reason that lays the groundwork for new directions in political theory

the work of giorgio agamben one of the world s most important living philosophers has been the object of much scrutiny yet there is one dimension of his thought that remains unexamined by scholars the presence of the ancient science of astrology in his writings this book the first of its kind identifies the astrological elements and explains the implications of their usage by agamben in so doing this study challenges us to imagine agamben s thought in a radically new light a critical account of the presence of astrology and related themes in agamben s writings ranging from the earlier works to the more recent publications illustrates that the astrological signature constitutes a mode of philosophical archaeology that allows for an enhanced understanding of concepts that are central to his works such as potentiality the signature bare life and biopolitics

we live today within a system in which state and corporate power aim to render space flat transparent and uniform for only then can it be truly controlled the gaze of power and the commodity form are capable of infiltrating even the darkest of corners and often we invite them into our most private spaces we do so as a matter of convenience but also to placate ourselves and cope with the alienation inherent in our everyday lives the resulting dominant space can best be termed totalitarian it is space stripped of uniqueness deprived of the spatial aura necessary for authentic experience in totalitarian space and the destruction of aura saladdin ahmed sets out to help us grasp what has been lost before no trace remains he draws attention to that which we might prefer not to see but despite the bleakness of this indictment of reality the book also offers a message of hope namely it is only once we comprehend the magnitude of the threat to our spatial experience and our own complicity in sustaining this system that we can begin to resist the totalizing forces at work

jacques rancière s work has challenged many of the assumptions of contemporary continental philosophy by placing equality at the forefront of emancipatory political thought and aesthetics drawing on the claim that egalitarian politics persistently appropriates elements from political philosophy to engage new forms of dissensus devin zane shaw argues that rancière s work also provides an opportunity to reconsider modern philosophy and aesthetics in light of the question of equality in part i shaw examines rancière s philosophical debts to the good sense of cartesian egalitarianism and the existentialist critique of identity in part ii he outlines rancière s critical analyses of walter benjamin and clement greenberg and offers a reinterpretation of rancière s debate with alain badiou in light of the philosophical differences between schiller and schelling from engaging debates about political subjectivity from descartes to sartre to delineating the egalitarian stakes

in aesthetics and the philosophy of art from schiller to badiou this book presents a concise tour through a series of egalitarian moments found within the histories of modern philosophy and aesthetics

archaeological theory in the new millennium provides an account of the changing world of archaeological theory and a challenge to more traditional narratives of archaeological thought it charts the emergence of the new emphasis on relations as well as engaging with other current theoretical trends and the thinkers archaeologists regularly employ bringing together different strands of global archaeological theory and placing them in dialogue the book explores the similarities and differences between different contemporary trends in theory while also highlighting potential strengths and weaknesses of different approaches written in a way to maximise its accessibility in direct contrast to many of the sources on which it draws archaeological theory in the new millennium is an essential guide to cutting edge theory for students and for professionals wishing to reacquaint themselves with this field

winner of the children s literature association book award this book visits a range of textual forms including diary novel and picturebook to explore the relationship between second generation memory and contemporary children s literature ulanowicz argues that second generation memory informed by intimate family relationships textual mediation and technology is characterized by vicarious rather than direct experience of the past as such children s literature is particularly well suited to the representation of second generation memory insofar as children s fiction is particularly invested in the transmission and reproduction of cultural memory and its form promotes the formation of various complex intergenerational relationships further children s books that depict second generation memory have the potential to challenge conventional western notions of selfhood and ethics this study shows how novels such as lois lowry s the giver 1993 and judy blume s starring sally j freedman as herself 1977 both of which feature protagonists who adapt their elders memories into their own mnemonic repertoires implicitly reject cartesian notions of the unified subject in favor of a view of identity as always already social relational and dynamic in character this book not only questions how and why second generation memory is represented in books for young people but whether such representations of memory might be considered radical or conservative together these analyses address a topic that has not been explored fully within the fields of children s literature trauma and memory studies and holocaust studies

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
