in terms of major events the 20th century influences nations regions and peoples in profound and all inclusive ways it was a century of earth shaking contradictory events great evil genocide and destruction on massive scales on the one hand and at the same time inventions discoveries and political social improvements which have improved the lives of billions of people most of the inventors and scientists and in too many cases the worst tyrants were europeans the pages within guide the reader on this exciting often bloody and yet hope filled journey edgar b schick ph d arthur drea has written a compelling and readable primer of the utmost intellectual value to history students and the general public alike for a course in european history of the twentieth century he achieves this desired effect with exactitude and concision which match his course s focus on just over one hundred years of causation leading to the contemporary state of european society and economy indeed every tributary stream of events of this social political and economic type is seamlessly channeled into the main course of drea s explanation and analysis with the flawless timing that characterizes narrative history at its best edwin l hetfield jr ph d

in what is often considered to be the heyday of classical indian culture the 4th and 5th centuries ad the dynasty of the vākāṭakas emerged as one of the major patrons of religion and art covering the

greater part of the northern deccan the vākāṭaka kingdoms were situated at the crossroads of the main north south and west east caravan routes this situation in the heart of the south asian subcontinent may partly explain the prosperity of the vākāṭaka kingdoms and certainly accounts for their cultural diversity and richness to which the hindu temples on and around the rāmagiri ramtek hill and the buddhist caves at ajanta still bear witness here at the crossroads of the lndo aryan north and dravidian south the northern culture of the gupta kingdom reached the deccan and developed a character of its own the articles collected in this volume intend to augment our knowledge of how the vākāṭaka culture came into being which forces and influences contributed to its flourishing and how its achievements informed the historical and cultural developments after its fall richly illustrated contributions address the vākāṭaka heritage from a variety of disciplines history kulke von stietencron archaeology kennet numismatics raven political and religious history willis bakker iconography brown yokochi and art history williams spink wood stadtner and nigam

the field of cultural heritage is no longer solely dependent on the expertise of art and architectural historians archaeologists conservators curators and site and museum administrators it has dramatically expanded across disciplinary boundaries and social contexts with even the basic definition of what constitutes cultural heritage being widened far beyond the traditional categories of architecture artifacts archives and art heritage now includes vernacular architecture intangible cultural practices knowledge and language performances and rituals as well as cultural landscapes heritage has also become increasingly entangled with the broader social political and economic contexts in which heritage is created managed transmitted protected or even destroyed heritage protection now encompasses a growing set of methodological approaches whose objectives are not necessarily focused upon the maintenance of material fabric which has traditionally been cultural heritage s primary concern the oxford handbook of public heritage theory and practice charts some of the major sites of convergence between the humanities and the social sciences where new disciplinary perspectives are being brought to bear on heritage these convergences have the potential to provide the interdisciplinary expertise needed not only to critique but also to achieve the intertwined intellectual political and socioeconomic goals of cultural heritage in the twenty first century this volume highlights the potential contributions of development studies political science anthropology management studies human geography ecology psychology sociology cognitive studies and education to heritage studies

first published in 1937 india s social heritage is intended to give a simple statement of the principal features of the social system in pre independence india the social system of pre independence india retained many features characteristic of an early stage of social growth society was still largely communal in the sense that it was organized in groups individual life was based on collective standards and had to be in harmony as a unit in a group to whose interests his own were subordinate the social system may be described as a synthesis of groups rather than persons while the joint family was the basis of hindu law this book will be of interest to students of history sociology and south asian studies

showing and telling is the first academic work to explore how publicly funded film heritage institutes account for their mandate in their public activities it does that by inspecting and evaluating public presentations and visitor information about these presentations the research was done by juxtaposing two complementary approaches the first is grounded in the author's experience as a collection researcher and curator and makes a case for the richness of archival objects usually ignored for their lack of aesthetic qualities the second is a survey of the public activities of 24 institutes worldwide based on their websites in february 2014 the latter constitutes a unique source this original work uncovers the disconnect between the curatorial activities of these institutes and

their missions a central finding is that publicly funded film heritage institutes give their public an inadequate sense of cinema history by and large they offer a mainstream oriented repertoire of presentations overwhelmingly consisting of feature fiction they show a disproportionate amount of recent and new works often through commercial distribution their screenings consist of an unexplained melee of technological formats sometimes substandard and their presentations monotonously frame film as art although their professed aesthetics are mostly of a cinephile nature and rest on received opinion specific materials early cinema in particular and specialist knowledge both historical and methodological are largely restricted to their network of peer communities wholesome transfer of full knowledge in word and image to the public is not a major concern showing and telling concludes with recommendations for curatorial activities firstly with a conceptual apparatus that allows a more complete understanding of film heritage and its histories secondly with a plea for rethinking the institutes gatekeeper function and for developing more varied imaginative and informative public presentations both on site and online that reflect the range of their collections and their histories

beginning in the mid nineteenth century large numbers of people from mainland china emigrated to the united states and other countries seeking employment termed overseas chinese they made lasting contributions to the development of early communities an impact which has only begun to be recognized in recent years chinatowns rural mining claims work camps for railroad and other construction activities salmon canneries and shrimp camps laundries stores cook shacks cemeteries and temples are only some of the sites where traces of their presence can be found in recent years numerous archaeological and historical investigations of the overseas chinese have taken place and hidden heritage presents the results of some of those studies

the asia pacific region s enormous diversity of living cultures and preserved heritage sites has significant appeal to many tourists however tourism has grown so rapidly that many issues associated with the incorporation of cultural and heritage experiences in tourist itineraries such as authenticity verses commodification exploitation of national cultures impacts on local communities and the management of heritage resources have not been adequately addressed and must be debated this revealing book reviews recent developments in cultural and heritage tourism in the asia pacific region and provides a discussion on how communities have faced and overcome significant challenges to develop and market their culture and heritage resources a range of models and case studies are used to deepen the reader s understanding of heritage and cultural issues to illustrate many of the more controversial issues and to examine new evaluative and planning tools this book is a special issue of the asia pacific journal of tourism research

aerobiology is the science that studies the biological component of the atmosphere and its effects on living systems and on the environment this term was used for the first time in 1935 but the attention of scientists to the biological component of the atmosphere goes back to 1769 when the italian biologist spallanzani carried out a series of experiments that disproved the concept of spontaneous generation of life and proved the presence of viable microorganisms in the air aerobiology has marked characteristics of interdisciplinarity its application fields range from respiratory diseases to the airborne outbreak of animal and vegetal diseases and to the biodegradation of substances and materials the latter is the subject of this book the purpose of aerobiological research applied to the conservation of cultural heritage is to evaluate the risk of alteration by airborne microorganisms of materials forming artefacts of historical artistic and archaeological interest airborne spores and vegetative structures may develop on different substrates and may be a cause of degradation in relation to the types of materials the microclimatic situation and the pollution of the conservation environments the qualitative and quantitative evaluation of

the biological component of air performed by means of targeted analysis campaigns and of the characteristics of materials and environments supplies indispensable information for the evaluation of the actual risk and the planning of interventions this book is divided into four main parts

this book explores how cultural heritage and its care are translated in uk law and non law instruments it analyses how communities of care look after cultural heritage because they care about it these communities include the international and national community national and local governments courts professional bodies institutions such as museums as well as community groups care refers to the varied ways in which communities engage with cultural heritage to maintain it sustain relationships about it and with it use it and provide access to it with a view to passing it on to future generations the book also assesses how far these nested practices of care assist communities of care in providing respectful empathetic and dialogical care to navigate harm to cultural heritage it will be of interest to scholars of cultural heritage studies across disciplines including law sociology and anthropology as well as policymakers and practitioners in cultural heritage management
