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this book contributes to the field of mathematical problem solving by exploring current themes trends and research perspectives it does so by addressing five broad and related dimensions problem solving heuristics problem solving and technology inquiry and problem posing in mathematics education assessment of and through problem solving and the problem solving environment mathematical problem solving has long been recognized as an important aspect of mathematics teaching mathematics and learning mathematics it has influenced mathematics curricula around the world with calls for the teaching of problem solving as well as the teaching of mathematics

through problem solving and as such it has been of interest to mathematics education researchers for as long as the field has existed research in this area has generally aimed at understanding and relating the processes involved in solving problems to students development of mathematical knowledge and problem solving skills the accumulated knowledge and field developments have included conceptual frameworks for characterizing learners success in problem solving activities cognitive metacognitive social and affective analysis curriculum proposals and ways to promote problem solving approaches

the mixed year problem solving toolkit teacher book and cd provides ideas for teaching the full range of problem solving strategies offers guidance on when to use each strategy contains a planning chart for integration alongside any maths topic includes problems for pupils to practise each strategy includes mixed problems where pupils can decide which strategy to use

crossword or writing an essay has a goal in this comprehensive and timely textbook the author discusses the psychological processes underlying such goal directed problem solving and examines both how we learn from experience of problem solving and how our learning transfers or often fails to transfer from one situation to another following initial coverage of the methods we use to solve unfamiliar problems the book goes on to examine the psychological processes involved in novice problem solving before progressing to the methods and processes used by skilled problem solvers or experts topics covered include how we generate a useful representation of a problem as a starting point general problem solving strategies we use in unfamiliar situations possible processes involved in insight or lateral thinking the nature of problem similarity and the role of analogies in problem solving understanding and learning from textbooks and how we develop expertise through the learning of specific problem solving skills clear up to date and accessible problem solving will be of interest to undergraduates and postgraduates in cognitive psychology cognitive science and educational psychology the focus on the practical transfer of learning through problem solving will also make it of relevance to educationalists and business psychologists

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
