teaching our story is based on the premise that as congregations become intentional story forming communities they can shape the lives of millions of generative faithful and civic minded adults to do so a framework that relates narrative work to the full range of congregational life is needed this book offers such a framework featuring essays that examine crucial shapers of narrative outline a course in preaching that addresses crucial questions for today s church leaders illuminate the creative power of listening to the collective stories of a faith community and observe what can happen when first year seminary students are asked to become story brokers integrating the stories from their communities with biblical stories their own personal stories and the theological doctrines formed within the story of their tradition

since the 1970s louis bird a distinguished aboriginal storyteller and historian has been recording the stories and memories of omushkego swampy cree communities along western hudson and james bays in nine chapters he presents some of the most vivid legends and historical stories from his collection casting new light on his people s history culture and values working with the editors and other contributors to provide background and context for the stories he illuminates their many levels of meaning and brings forward the value system and world view that underlie their teachings students of aboriginal culture history and literature will find that this is no ordinary book of stories compiled from a remote disconnected voice but rather a project in which the teller deeply engaged in preserving his people s history language and values is committed to bringing his listeners and readers as far along the road to understanding as he possibly can

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click additional materials for downloadable sample this book presents two stories created by michael schiro and told by doris lawson in her mathematics classroom the authors lay a foundation for weaving together mathematics and an epic story the purpose of telling an epic story one that takes several days to finish is to guide students through several stages of learning in order to help them develop mathematical skills the story not only presents mathematical skills that students need to learn but also situates the mathematics in a context that is interesting engaging and relevant part 1 the wizard s tale discusses teaching addition and multidigit number the full story with commentary is presented this story is intended primarily for second third and fourth grade students part 2 the egypt story connects problem solving and the social studies curriculum by exploring ancient egypt this story has been used with sixth graders an accompanying cd contains the complete text of each story and the worksheets used during the lesson various other materials needed are also described if it is true that every teacher is an actor or actress at heart the challenge to develop one s oral story telling skills is intriguing equally important however is the rich discussion

in this collection of essays young adult authors explore their experiences of injustice empowerment and growing up female in america they explore themes on the intersection of race and gender women and weight first sexual experience the devastation of rape culture and much more adapted from jacket

these are our stories is a collection of women's stories, thoughts, and poems about the domestic abuse they have experienced throughout their lives, transcribed directly from Jan Rosenberg's interviews with eleven women in the Florida panhandle. Their histories embody the epidemic of domestic violence in America. The eleven survivors are lower to middle class women of various ethnic orientations and range in age from their late twenties to mid sixties. The survivors' stories are clarified with the use of diagrams from the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project (DAIP) and examined as the women rebuild their lives hour by hour and day by day. *These Are Our Stories* provides two resource guides following the women's interviews. The first guide is adapted for use in North Florida to assist an abused woman in identifying her situation using these eleven women's stories as a thread. The second resource is a brief bibliography of literature and resources for domestic violence victims that can be used throughout the U.S.
