friendship lasted for more than thirty years as their paths crossed and recrossed in new york hollywood and mississippi in count no count wasson muses over this long and close relationship in anecdotal accounts which he calls flashbacks wasson depicts a faulkner who is humorous occasionally naive aggressive and loving at times he is the most courteous of gentlemen at other times he is a tragic figure attempting to deal with griefs and disappointment by lapsing into alcoholic binges the reader will discern a faulkner whose artistic and creative nature produced sometimes bizarre behavior and destructive drives for achievement
