one hundred twenty six million american citizens have stated they believe jesus will return to this earth by 2050 most of them await his arrival with mental pictures and images obtained from the blockbuster left behind series of books of lahaye and jenkins or hal lindsey s portrayals in his book the late great planet earth both books are fictional images of the end of the world created from the nightmarish and ghoulish descriptions of the author of the book of revelation who wrote of events he believed were to occur in the roman world before the return of jesus it was to be a time of unimaginable horrors to come upon the world we read daily of alleged apocalyptic signs occurring now which individuals believe point to the end of the age of which jesus spoke when one reads in detail the book of revelation before the prince of peace sets a foot on planet earth it will be a smoking mess resulting from plague after plague that jesus heaps upon earth s citizenry before his arrival jesus is shown to arrive on earth much like that of the dragon lady in the game of thrones heaping fire and brimstone upon the ecology of the earth and its inhabitants he wears a garment dipped in blood this book is a bold walk through the bible from beginning to end asserting that occupants of

our planet are never going to ever see the arrival of the characters portrayed in the prophetic books of the old testament nor john s already outdated visions on the isle of patmos world renowned bible scholars and theologians now tell us that jesus believed the kingdom of god was to arrive on earth in his day and that the kingdom of god would be ushered into the world through his work and ministry to the nation of israel you will be introduced throughout to the jesus of the third quest a jesus who is only understood by understanding the judaic world in which he lived he would have been potty trained like any normal jewish child of his day jesus it will be shown obtained all his beliefs from his family his synagogue his community and his society this book will open your eyes to jesus of the third quest he was very human capable of mistakes and badly mistaken about the arrival of the kingdom of god christians generally think of jesus being incapable of error possessing omniscience and omnipotence and having prior existence as god wholly man and wholly god as did the author third quest scholars and theologians tell us jesus didn t see beyond the world in which he lived jesus expected to rule on earth in his day along with the twelve apostles most likely jesus died feeling he was forsaken by god in what he set out to do of jesus disputed last words on the cross the most reasonable choice may well be those of matthew s gospel eli eli lama sabachthani my god my god why have you forsaken me

according to robert john russell one of the foremost scholars on relating christian theology and science the topic of time and eternity is central to the relation between god and the world in two ways first it involves the notion of the divine eternity as the supratemporal source of creaturely time second it involves the eternity of the eschatological new creation beginning with the bodily resurrection of jesus in relation to creaturely time the key to russell s engagement with these issues and the purpose of this book is to explore wolfhart pannenberg s treatment of time and eternity in relation to mathematics physics and cosmology time in eternity is the first book length exposition of russell s unique method for relating christian theology and the natural sciences which he calls creative mutual interaction cmi this method first calls for a reformulation of theology in light of science and then for the delineation of possible topics for research in science drawing on this reformulated theology accordingly russell first reformulates pannenberg s discussion of the divine attributes eternity and omnipresence in light of the way time and space are treated in mathematics physics and cosmology this leads him to construct a correlation of eternity and omnipresence in light of the spacetime framework of einstein s special relativity in the process he proposes a new flowing time interpretation of relativity to counter the usual block universe interpretation supported by most physicists and philosophers of science russell also replaces pannenberg s use of hegel s concept of infinity in relation to the divine attributes with the concept of infinity drawn from the mathematics of georg cantor russell then addresses the enormous challenge raised by big bang cosmology to christian eschatology in response he draws on pannenberg s interpretation both of the resurrection as a proleptic manifestation of the eschatological new creation within history and the present as the arrival of the future russell shows how such a reformulated understanding of theology can shed light on possible directions for fundamental research in physics and cosmology these lead him to explore preconditions in contemporary physics research for the possibility of duration copresence retroactive causality and prolepsis in nature

for centuries science and faith have been drifting apart science lost its transcendent foundations faith lost its credibility science conquered the future faith got stuck in the past science unleashed unprecedented powers faith became a private pastime the economic and ecological consequences are catastrophic science and faith must reconnect and lead the way out of the crisis

did the early church of rome conspire with the pagan emperor constantine to create a new religion for the west superseding judaism and displacing the children of israel as god s first born son exodus 4 22 catholic scholar bernard lee observed most christological interpretation has been supersessionist that is it has interpreted jesus as initiating a new covenant that supersedes judaism historically it is quite improbable that jesus had any such thing in mind similarly there is little likelihood that jesus had any conscious intention of founding a new religious institution either superseding judaism or alongside it the obvious question is if that was not in the mind of jesus on whose life and teachings christianity is said to be based in whose mind was it this study examines the wealth of evidence that has convinced the author that in truth christianity is a centuries old conspiracy with significant anti jewish undercurrents
