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how digital social reading apps are powerfully changing and nurturing the way we read conventional wisdom would have us believe that digital technology is a threat to reading but in digital social reading federico pianzola argues that reading socially through digital media can help people grow a passion for reading and in some cases even enhance text comprehension digital social reading dsr is a term that encompasses a wide variety of practices related to the activity of reading and using digital technologies and platforms websites social media mobile apps to share thoughts and impressions about books with others this book is the first systematization of dsr practices drawing on case studies from wattpad ao3 and goodreads on a worldwide scale using a combination of qualitative and computational methods pianzola offers fresh insight into the reading experience on the scale of big data he discusses the impact of digital technology on

reading skills and shows that a change of methodological perspective is necessary to understand the positive potential of dsr for promoting reading more broadly he argues that it is not just the medium that changes but also the context and the attitudes of readers he also asserts that grassroots media and open bottom up communities are crucial to the success of many reading practices today especially with young audiences
