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this book represents an original interpretation of the state of israel a jewish political renaissance in the modern era it probes the meaning of zionism in the historical context and examines critically the founding of the state its underlying principle themes and political orientation at root the analysis focuses on the secular ideological basis of israel and the rejection in 1948 of any search for an authentic projection of the new state as a philosophical continuation of judaism the book is organized primarily around the jewish arab completion and conflict in the land of israel while the deeper philosophical and ideological topics provide a framework and context for israel s collective political identity

the nation state of israel is a short and concise overview of israel that includes its patriarchal history since abraham its geography and environment its economy culture and demographics its government and legal system zionism and the holocaust its conflicts and peace since 1948

sandler contends that the impact of the nation in foreign policy is not synonymous with that of the state understanding the effect of the nation is important because of the contemporary reawakening of primordial national aspirations this study is designed to test these views by examining nation centered concerns in foreign policy as practiced within israel it reviews and analyzes the roots of the territorial dimension in israeli foreign policy since the establishment of the state up to the present the impact of israeli domestic politics and the rise and fall of ethnonationalism in israeli foreign policy as such the work is of concern to all students of israeli politics and foreign policy and the arab israeli conflict

how do emerging states become full functioning members of the international system in this book cameron g thies argues that new and emerging states are subject to socialization efforts by current member states which guide them in locating their position in the international system thies develops a theoretical approach to understanding how states socialize each other into and out of different roles in the international system such as regional power ally and peacekeeper the concept of state socialization is developed using role theory a middle range theory developed in the interdisciplinary field of social psychology this middle range theory helps to flesh out the theoretical mechanisms often missing in grand theories like neorealism and constructivism the result is a structural theory of international politics that also allows for the explanation of actual foreign policy behavior by states the foreign policy histories of the u s and israel are analyzed using this theoretical approach to show how international social pressure has affected the kinds of roles they have adopted throughout their histories as well as the kinds of roles that they have not been allowed to adopt by considering the effects of international socialization attempts on their foreign policy behavior thies shows the well known cases of the u s and israel in a new light the united states israel and the search for international order argues that the process by which states learn their appropriate roles and behaviors in the international social order is crucial to understanding international conflict and cooperation which will be significant for those studying both theory and method in international relations foreign policy and diplomatic history

schoenbaum s book is a history of one of the most remarkable liaisons in international experience a portrait of the special relationship between the last remaining superpower and the tiny jewish state between the jordan and the mediterranean and a study of how that relationship grew and works from truman to bush the united states has assured israel s existence while providing billions in military and economic support over the same period no u s president has ever submitted a formal treaty of alliance to the senate or even moved the american embassy from tel aviv to jerusalem in fact cross purposes and mutual doubts have

always coexisted with shared values complementary interests great expectations and real achievements schoenbaum's book traces israeli american relations from their roots in both american and jewish experience to the risks and opportunities of the current peace process it also examines the relationship in the perspective of two world wars the cold war the gulf war european colonialism and middle eastern nationalisms global policy and domestic politics in both countries the result is the story of one of history's oddest international couples hard pressed to live together but unable to live apart

amnon rubinstein and alexander yakobson explore the nature of israel's identity as a jewish state how that is compatible with liberal democratic norms and is comparable with a number of european states

as the fiftieth anniversary of israeli statehood approaches along with the commemoration of the hundredth anniversary of the world zionist organization the question of what is meant by a jewish state is particularly timely alan dowty takes on that question in a book that is admirable for its clarity and its comprehensive interpretation of the historical roots and contemporary functioning of israel israeli nationhood democracy and politics did not unfold in a social or political vacuum but developed from power sharing practices in pre state jewish communities in palestine and in eastern europe dowty elucidates the broad cluster of cultural historical and ideological tenets which came to comprise israel's contemporary political system he demonstrates that such tenets were not arbitrary but in fact developed logically from jewish political habits and the circumstances of time dowty illustrates how these traditions are balanced with those of ideology and modernization and he provides an integrated sophisticated analysis of the israeli nation's formation and present state dowty also proposes thoughtful answers to puzzles regarding the strengths and weaknesses of israeli democracy in responding to the challenges of communal divisions religious contention the country's non jewish minority and accommodation with the palestinians the jewish state will be invaluable for anyone looking for that one book that gives an intelligent overview of both israel today and of its origins

defining israel the jewish state democracy and the law is the first book in any language devoted to the controversial passage of israel s nation state law israel has no constitution and though it calls itself the jewish state there is no agreement among israelis on how that fact should be reflected in the government s laws or by its courts since the 1990s a number of civil society groups and legislators have drafted constitutions and proposed basic laws with constitutional standing that would clarify what it means for israel to be a jewish and democratic state are these bills liberal or chauvinist are they a defense of the knesset or an attack on the independence of the courts is their intention democratic or anti democratic the fight over the nation state law whether to have one and what should be in it toppled the 19th knesset s governing coalition and even after its passage on july 29 2018 remains a point of contention among israel s lawmakers and increasingly the israeli public defining israel brings together influential scholars journalists and politicians observers and participants opponents and proponents jews and arabs all debating the merits and meaning of israel s nation state law together with translations of each draft law the final law and other key documents the essays and sources in defining israel are essential to understand the ongoing debate over what it means for israel to be a jewish and democratic state
