thomas schreiner a respected scholar and a trusted voice for many students and pastors offers a substantial and accessibly written overview of the whole bible he traces the storyline of the scriptures from the standpoint of biblical theology examining the overarching message that is conveyed throughout schreiner emphasizes three interrelated and unified themes that stand out in the biblical narrative god as lord human beings as those who are made in god's image and the land or place in which god's rule is exercised the goal of god's kingdom is to see the king in his beauty and to be enraptured in his glory

what is the central theme of the bible given the diversity of authorship genre and context of the bible's various books is it even possible to answer such a question or in trying to do so is an external grid being unnaturally superimposed on the biblical text these are difficult questions that the discipline of biblical theology has struggled to answer in this thoroughly revised and expanded edition of his classic toward an old testament theology walter kaiser offers a solution to these unresolved issues he proposes that there is indeed a unifying center to the theology and message of the bible that is indicated and affirmed by scripture itself that center is the promise of god it is one all encompassing promise of life through the messiah that winds itself throughout salvation history in both the old and new testaments giving cohesiveness and unity to the various parts of scripture after laying out his proposal kaiser works chronologically through the books of both testaments demonstrating how the promise is seen throughout how the various sub themes of each book relate to the promise and how god's plan to fulfill the promise progressively unfolds here is a rich and illuminating biblical theology that will stir the emotion and the intellect

ancient cultures such as that of the hebrews commonly associated wisdom with advanced years in a biblical theology of gerassapience the author investigates the validity of this correlation through an eclectic approach including linguistic semantic tradition historical and socio anthropological methods to pertinent biblical and extra biblical texts there are significant variations in the estimation of gerassapience or old age wisdom in each period of ancient israel's life that is in pre monarchical monarchical and post monarchical israel throughout this study appropriate cross cultural parallels are drawn from the cultures of ancient israel's

neighbors and of modern societies such as the west african yoruba tribe the overall results are bi dimensional on the one hand there are semantic elements of gerassapience such as the elusiveness of wisdom and the mild fluidity of old age both terms have strong contextual affinity with minimal exceptions thus the attribution of wisdom to old age is evident but not absolute in the hebrew bible old testament on the other hand gerassapience is depicted as primarily didactic through direct and indirect instructions and counsels of the elderly fostering the saging fear of yahweh legacies on the whole socio anthropocentric tendencies of gerassapience that is of making old age a repertoire of wisdom are checked by theological warrants of theosapience yahwistic wisdom therefore in the hebrew bible the fear of yahweh is also the beginning of growing old and wise

excerpt from biblical theology of the old testament biblical theology is one of the more recent branches of theology our older theologians did not distinguish between dogmatic and biblical theology during the whole development of church doctrine down to the middle of the present century no distinct line was drawn between the essential contents of revelation as they are laid down in the scriptures and the doctrinal formulas elaborated from them and still less were the successive stages of revelation and the types of doctrine which are presented in scripture recognized the bible was supposed to attest equally in the old and new testaments the truths which the church has accepted as doctrines the old testament being used in all its parts just like the new testament for proofs of doctrine but our modern theologians maintain that the old and new testament stand to each other in the relation of preparation and fulfilment that their unity must not be understood as identity that the old testament itself acknowledges that the manifestation of god s kingdom at that time was imperfect and temporary that still more distinctly does the new testament emphasize the
