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why are spicy cuisines characteristic of hot climates does our stomach or our brain tell us when it is time to eat and how do we decide if bugs are food employing a learner centered approach this introduction to the psychological mechanisms of consumption engages readers with questions and cross cultural examples to promote critical analysis and evidence based comprehension the discipline of psychology provides an important perspective to the study of eating given the remarkable complexity of our food environments including society and culture eating habits and relationships with food as everything psychological is simultaneously biological the role of evolutionary pressures and biopsychological forces are bases to explore

complex processes within the book such as sensation and perception learning and cognition and human development the authors illuminate contemporary eating topics including the scope and consequences of overnutrition the aetiology of eating disorders societal focus on dieting and body image controversies in food policy and culture inspired cuisine supplemental resources and exercises are provided in a pedagogically focused companion website

and up to date coverage it places psychopathology in its multiple contexts historical social and cultural it stresses the continuity between normality and abnormality and it attends to human diversity more than the typical textbook

the formative tendency i have often pointed out that in my work with individuals in therapy and in my experience in encounter groups i have been led to the conviction that human nature is essentially constructive when in a therapeutic climate which can be objectively defined a person becomes sharply aware of more of his or her internal experiencing and of the stimuli and demands from the external world thus acquiring a full range of options the person tends to move in the direction of becoming a socially constructive organism but many are critical of this point of view why should such a positive direction be observed only in humans isn't this just pure optimism so quite hesitantly because i have to draw on the work and thinking of others rather than on my own experience i should like to try to set this directional tendency in a much broader context i shall draw on my general reading in the field of science but i should like to mention a special indebtedness to the work of lancelot whyte in the universe of experience harper and row 1974 the last book he wrote before his death though the book has flaws in my judgment this historian has some thought provoking themes to advance i have learned from many others as well
