Interventions Question 4 You are treating a patient in cardiac arrest You have confirmed pulseless electrical activity PEA on the monitor Which of the following is NOT a key component of the initial management strategy for PEA Answer Defibrillation PEA is not a shockable rhythm Defibrillation is only indicated for ventricular fibrillation VF and pulseless ventricular tachycardia VT Explanation The initial focus for PEA is to identify and address the underlying cause Hs and Ts hypovolemia hypoxia hydrogen ions hypoglycemia hyperkalemia hypothermia tension pneumothorax tamponade toxins and provide supportive measures like CPR and medications Question 5 During the management of a patient with stable monomorphic ventricular tachycardia which of the following medications is the firstline treatment Answer Amiodarone Amiodarone is an antiarrhythmic medication used to suppress ventricular tachycardia Explanation While other medications like lidocaine or procainamide may be used amiodarone is the preferred firstline agent for stable monomorphic VT Question 6 You are caring for a patient who has just received a shock for ventricular fibrillation What is the next step in the management Answer Immediately resume CPR After defibrillation continued CPR is crucial to maintain blood flow until the heart regains a rhythm Explanation Resuming CPR after defibrillation ensures continued blood flow to vital organs potentially allowing for spontaneous return of circulation ROSC or providing time for medication administration Section 3 Pharmacology and Medication Administration Question 7 What is the correct dose of epinephrine for an adult patient in cardiac arrest Answer 1 mg IV or IO repeated every 35 minutes as needed Explanation Epinephrine is a potent vasoconstrictor and bronchodilator used to improve circulation and increase heart contractility during cardiac arrest Question 8 You are administering medication to a patient through an endotracheal tube What is the general rule of thumb for the drug dose compared to the IV dose Answer 225 times the IV dose Explanation The endotracheal route bypasses the pulmonary circulation resulting in a lower concentration of medication reaching the bloodstream Question 9 You are preparing to administer sodium bicarbonate to a patient in cardiac arrest What is the primary indication for this medication Answer Metabolic acidosis Sodium bicarbonate is used to correct severe metabolic acidosis often seen in patients with prolonged cardiac arrest Explanation While often considered the benefits of
