4 Exercises for Integration Substitution Exercise Replace the lyrics of a song with lines from a play or monologue that evoke similar emotions This helps connect the emotional landscape of acting to your singing Character Song Exercise Choose a song that doesnt explicitly fit your character but whose 3 emotions resonate with their inner life Interpret the song through the lens of your characters experience Improvisation Exercise Improvise scenes using song fragments allowing spontaneity and emotional freedom to enhance your performance This builds confidence and reduces vocal anxiety

5 Seeking Feedback Professional Guidance Record Yourself Regularly record your performances to identify areas for improvement Listen critically to your vocal delivery and emotional expression Work with a Coach A qualified vocal coach and acting coach can provide personalized feedback and guidance helping you refine your technique and overcome specific challenges Consider coaches specializing in musical theatre
