collection development is a compilation of 20 papers that explore the assumption that mission affects policy to what extent do the unique features and mission of the small college library create distinctive concerns for it the papers presented here demonstrate an alternative to the assumption that what works in large university libraries will also work in small ones

in the last decade the rates of enrollment and retention of many students of color have declined access and completion rates for african american hispanic and native american students have always lagged behind white and asian students as have those for low income students and students with disabilities because students of color often make up a much smaller percentage of students in studies their experiences and needs are often lost and go undetected as the authors note the united states will become significantly less white over the next fifty years so these issues are becoming more urgent we must have institution wide programs to improve the graduation rates of minority students pre college preparation admission policies affirmative action and financial aid are important factors but campus wide support from the chancellor s office to the classroom is critical to success this ashe eric higher education report is intended as a reference for key stakeholders regarding the realities of and strategies for student retention it is our hope that it will serve as a compass for those with the complex task of improving retention

surveys the changing landscape of american higher education from academic freedom to virtual universities from campus crime to pell grants from the student privacy act to student diversity in the years following world war ii college and university enrollment doubled students revolted faculty unionized and community colleges evolved tuition and technology soared as did the number of first generation minority and women students these changes radically transformed the american system of postsecondary education today that system is in trouble its aging professoriate prepares for retirement but low academic salaries can no longer attract the best minds to replace them a flood of corporate dollars funds commercial research but money for basic research the seedbed of american scientific preeminence has dried up colleges and universities also face heated competition with for profit education providers for students faculty and external financial support along with the costs of providing remedial education to growing numbers of students who are unprepared for
