than ever some survive and live out a normal life expectancy others have a life limiting life threatening diagnosis where death may come early and still others will live on well past projected life trajectories into adulthood with so many different care pathways children parents and communities often find themselves facing challenges for which neither they nor their healthcare systems are prepared this book opens a global discussion of these issues extending rita pfund's text palliative care nursing of children and young people it invites paediatric palliative care professionals parents and children from around the globe to share their knowledge and experience this book is of vital interest to palliative care professionals parents policy makers and academics it is an important move towards ensuring that all children and their families regardless of geographical location gender ethnicity or socio economic class have equal and guaranteed access to comprehensive paediatric palliative care services

the first edition of this book was the first authoritative systematic and comprehensive text to define the increasingly important and evolving specialty of paediatric palliative care it explores both the clinical aspects and the multidimensional and holistic nature of care for the dying child based on the knowledge that all human experience has a physical emotional psychological and spiritual impact the book covers ways of providing support in all of these areas both for the child families and carers recognising the importance of teamwork and taking an evidence based approach the oxford textbook of palliative care for children is about the care of children for whom cure of their underlying disease is not possible it encompasses the physical management of symptoms such as pain and nausea as well as social issues such as accessing appropriate education emotional issues such as techniques for communication and spiritual issues such as feelings of guilt and isolation the book suggests that if we are to maintain the quality of life for a child it is essential to recognise all these dimensions and try to address them this can only be done by recognising the skills of a wide range of professionals and working together in ways that are not always intuitive to any one discipline it explores the multidimensional and holistic nature of care for the dying child those working in paediatric palliative care recognise that all human experience has emotional psychological and spiritual impact as well as physical and this book offers the essential information needed for those involved in paediatric care to find ways of providing support in all of these areas comprehensive in scope exhaustive in detail and definitive in authority this second edition has been thoroughly updated to cover new practices current epidemiological data and the evolving models that support the delivery of

palliative medicine to children paediatric palliative care is now developing in countries with differing health care systems and being adapted to suit individual illnesses and the varying resources and geography in different parts of the world this book is an essential resource for anyone who works with children worldwide

the vast majority of the 100 000 or so children with serious mental or physical disabilities in britain today live at home with their families a series of in depth interviews carried out with a number of parents enabled the author to describe the extensive physical practical and emotional demands made on those looking after their disabled child at home in their own words parents report how and when they learnt about their child s disability the sheer physical work and mental effort of daily care which more often than not fall unremittingly on the child s mother the feelings of isolation and the lack of information which are often relieved only by talking with parents of other disabled children unshared care examines the community services available revealing that from the parents point of view the rhetoric of public concern is only barely matched by the practical support available it shows that services are all too often insufficiently specialized and lacking in coherence

this book provides the reader with a theoretical and practical understanding of two health care delivery models the patient child centred care and family centred care both are fundamental to caring for children in healthcare organizations the authors address their application in a variety of paediatric healthcare contexts as well as an understanding of legal and ethical issues they raise each model is increasingly pursued as a vehicle for guiding the delivery of health care in the best interests of children such models of health care delivery shape health care policies

programs facility design resource allocation decisions and day to day interactions among patients families physicians and other health care professionals to maximize the health and ethical benefits these models offer there must be shared understanding of what the models entail as well as the ethical and legal synergies and tensions they can create this book is a valuable resource for paediatricians nurses trainees graduate students practitioners of ethics and health policy

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
