silent. That was Helen Kellers reality from a very young age. Helen was born in Tuscumbia, Alabama in 1880. When she was just 19 months old she became ill with an unknown disease that left her blind and deaf. **Interactive Activity:** The World Without Senses. Close your eyes and plug your ears.
