at new york city s central park zoo two male penguins fall in love and start a family by taking turns sitting on an abandoned egg until it hatches based on actual events

a provocative collection that explores how intentional ignorance seeps into formal education honorable mention for the prose education theory award of the association of american publishers ignorance or the study of ignorance is having a moment ignorance plays a powerful role in shaping public opinion channeling our politics and even directing scholarly research the first collection of essays to grapple with the historical interplay between education and ignorance miseducation finds ignorance and its social production through naïveté passivity and active agency at the center of many pivotal historical developments ignorance allowed americans to maintain the institution of slavery nazis to promote ideas of race that fomented genocide in the 1930s and tobacco companies to downplay the dangers of cigarettes today ignorance enables some to deny the fossil record and others to ignore climate science a j angulo brings together seventeen experts from across the scholarly spectrum to explore how intentional ignorance seeps into formal education each chapter identifies education as a critical site for advancing our still limited understanding of what exactly ignorance is where it comes from and how it is diffused maintained and regulated in society miseducation also challenges the notion that schools are ideally unimpeachable sites of knowledge production access and equity by investigating how laws myths national aspirations and global relations have recast and at times distorted the key purposes of education this pathbreaking book sheds light on the role of ignorance in shaping ideas public opinion and policy

this collection focuses on the specific issue of controversy as a cross sectional aspect of contemporary children s and ya literature in a spectrum stretching from national experiences to explore the impact of specific historical economic and social environments on the rise of controversies to inter national exchanges in which controversies are generated specifically by the interactions between cultures to international contexts that deal with controversies relevant on a global scale by adopting controversy as an adjustable lens for a joined

consideration of literary themes narrative or aesthetic solutions translation choices publishing and marketing decisions and discursive practices the volume establishes a diversified collection of chapters that offers new insight into functions of children's and YA literature in contemporary culture

this book has its origins in a special issue of the journal *Science Education* volume 18 numbers 6-7 2009 the essay by Costas Skordoulis *Science and Worldviews in the Marxist Tradition* did not appear in that special issue due to a mistake in production scheduling it was published in an earlier issue of the journal volume 17 number 6 2008 but has been included in this book version of the special issue as explained in the introduction the catalyst for the journal special issue was the essay on *Science Worldviews and Education* submitted to the journal by Hugh G. Gauch Jr this was circulated to the other contributors who were asked to write their own contribution in the light of the arguments and literature contained in the paper Hugh made brief responses and clarifications after the papers were written however the Tanis Edis article on Islam and my own article on Priestley were processed too late to benefit from Hugh's appraisal the journal is associated with the International History Philosophy and Science Teaching Group which was formed in 1987 the group stages biennial international conferences and occasional regional conferences details can be found at ihpst.org the group though the journal conferences and its electronic newsletter at [ihpst](http://ihpst.org)

in this thoughtful and highly readable book Noël Sturgeon illustrates the myriad and insidious ways in which American popular culture depicts social inequities as natural and how our images of nature interfere with creating solutions to environmental problems that are just and fair for all why is it she wonders that environmentalist messages in popular culture so often naturalize themes of heroic male violence suburban nuclear family structures and U.S. dominance in the world and what do these patterns of thought mean for how we envision environmental solutions like green businesses recycling programs and the protection of threatened species although there are other books that examine questions of culture and environment this is the first book to employ a global feminist environmental

justice analysis to focus on how racial inequality gendered patterns of work and heteronormative ideas about the family relate to environmental questions beginning in the late 1980s and moving to the present day sturgeon unpacks a variety of cultural tropes including ideas about mother nature the purity of the natural and the allegedly close relationships of indigenous people with the natural world she investigates the persistence of the myth of the frontier and its extension to the frontier of space exploration she ponders the popularity and occasional controversy of penguins and penguin family values and questions assumptions about human warfare as natural the book is intended to provoke debates among college students and graduate students among their professors among environmental activists and among all citizens who are concerned with issues of environmental quality and social equality

pat scales has been a passionate advocate for intellectual freedom long before she launched the scales on censorship column with school library journal in 2006 decades of experience as a school librarian informs her ongoing work on these important and often volatile issues as did her tenure in leadership roles on the american library association s intellectual freedom committee and at the freedom to read foundation it also earned her a place among the inaugural list of library journal s movers shakers in 2002 since her first column for slj she has been in an ongoing conversation of sorts with librarians teachers and parents a much needed conversation this collection of the wide ranging questions from readers and scales informative answers are gathered in broad thematic groups to help readers explore the all too daily reality of confronting efforts to censor ban or otherwise limit open and ready access to materials in our schools and libraries they were all written in response to active book challenges or questions of intellectual freedom and library ethics these columns have a ripped from the headlines immediacy even as they reflect the core values and policies of librarianship they are organized by topic and each is framed with a brief new introductory essay scales powerful reputation and practical ethically based solutions has made her a key spokesperson and support for librarians working under a censorship siege her passionate

unwavering voice provides valuable strategic and tactical approaches to censorship fine tuned insight into individual books often challenged and critical moral support for managing trying conversations scales is focused throughout on fostering a culture that embraces and understands the importance of intellectual freedom and the tools to make it a reality every day in our libraries schools and communities learn from her to build a background in the ethics involved in defending intellectual freedom and lean on her for insights into real life situations scales on censorship is an essential ally in the ongoing fight
