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Robert A. M. Stern is one of contemporary architecture's most influential figures with a career encompassing every facet of the profession he has a flourishing private practice he is a noted authority on New York architectural history his own architectural work has been featured in numerous monographs and as dean of the Yale School of Architecture he has undeniably shaped the field of architectural education as a preeminent force in the discourse of the field

stern was one of the first critics to use and analyze the term postmodern in architecture this collection of essays stern s first brackets the years defined by the changes in architectural thinking introduced by robert venturi in 1966 and the exhibition deconstructivist architecture at the museum of modern art in 1988 throughout stern provides close readings of architectural events and offers firsthand accounts of transformations in architectural thinking during a critical period

modern and postmodern cutting edge films closely examines a wide variety of major filmic texts that have established permanent iconic shifts in modern and postmodern us culture and filmic practices these films and their often visionary trend setting auteurs each introduced new manners of seeing that were imitated by later directors and ultimately absorbed by popular culture itself the primary rationale for writing this collection was quite simple it is new and different no anthology exists that examines the concept of the cutting edge film across such a remarkably wide variety of genres and with such a diversity of theoretical approaches and subject matter equally important all the contributors bring a unique voice and multi disciplinary perspective to their respective chapters this anthology will be of great interest to scholars from a variety of disciplines including film studies historical studies and gender and genre studies as far as possible contributors have minimized a great deal of typical theoretical terminology so that lay readers who possess some familiarity with basic film analysis and theory can understand the text it can be used as a classroom text in both graduate and upper level undergraduate film classes modern and postmodern cutting edge films is an anthology that instructors of film theory and history can use for many years to come indeed we feel that this remarkable collection of essays will itself become an indispensable cutting edge text of film scholarship

s influential historical scholarship on topics such as the emergence and development of the dominican order in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries medieval women authors thomas aquinas and duns scotus and indeed on sweetman s own systematic contribution to the nature and promise of christian scholarship today

while critics collect around the question of what comes after postmodernism this book asks something different about recent american fiction what if we are seeing not the end of postmodernism but its belated success succeeding postmodernism examines how novels by delillo wallace danielwski foer and others conceptualize threats to individuals and communities posed by a poststructural culture of mediation and simulation and possible ways of resisting the disaffected solipsism bred by that culture ultimately it finds that twenty first century american fiction sets aside the postmodern problem of how language does or does not mean in order to raise the reassuringly retro question of what it can and does mean it finds that novels today offer language as solution to the problem of language thus it suggests a new way of reading antihumanist late postmodern fiction and a framework for understanding postmodern and twenty first century fiction as participating in a long and newly enlivened tradition of humanism and realism in literature

education redux is a timely and incisive work answering the myriad of questions about the future of america it is a general interest book of particular consequence to the current political and education debate the u s is facing a surfeit of crises social political economic and environmental these challenges continue to be met with traditional shortterm feel good snake oil remedies none of these actions begin to address the real structural problems in the u s economy or in its schools education redux examines the evolution of our economic despair the popular perception is that the definitive cure is better education there is a problem k 12 schools do not work per student spending on a constant dollar basis is up 600 over the past few decades yet standardized test scores remain flat the proposed solutions never change more money better teacher performance more parental involvement researchers dependably provide nothing more than minor variations on these themes reiterating hackneyed predicaments and fixes the school problem is essentially twofold first school curriculum and instructional design are incompatible with the predisposition of the new kids millennial cohort second schools are perceived by students as not relevant education professionals treat schools as though they operate in a vacuum which is a lethal error school reform agendas have to be responsive to students within the context of social and economic realities the loss of gainful employment opportunities in our economy is directly related to the dismantling of the american manufacturing sector the restoration of a 21st century manufacturing economy is predicated on our ability to infuse young people with the technical and entrepreneurial skills necessary to pursue productive careers for the new kids video games define their reality games are based on skill not following orders education redux offers an operational guide predicated on the use of up to date video game technology for making schools both relevant and enjoyable the requirement for individual expression and building a community through the development of group skills can be attained using a program called the e oneroom schoolhouse education redux is the product of comprehensive research by the author who has extensive formal training and experience in manufacturing finance teaching and community affairs the book answers questions most people are afraid to ask

instead of summing up the various perspectives of scholars and the variety of ideas to which the term postmodernism has been assigned this text lets this diversity speak for itself by bringing together articles and essays on the impact of the postmodern temper on an eclectic range of subjects berger presents a few of the many ways different theorists have come to terms with postmodernism while examining manifestations of postmodernism in the culture of everyday life
