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this is the third in a practical textbook series that provides a structured program for teaching language writing and thinking skills twenty self contained units cover a wide range of popular topics and features lively high interest texts as students work through the units the basics of english are taught logically and sequentially the move into english series is designed to complement and lead up to the highly successful into english by the same authors key features a clear focus

this book is designed to help students with limited english proficiency make the transition from reading their first language to reading english

dual language education is a program that combines language minority and language majority students for instruction through two languages this book provides the conceptual background for the program and discusses major implementation issues research findings summarize language proficiency and achievement outcomes from 8000 students at 20 schools along with teacher and parent attitudes

this volume offers a view of the linguistic situation in hong kong in the final years of the twentieth century as it enters the post colonial era in the chapters of this book scholars from hong kong and around the world present a contemporary profile of chinese english and other languages in dynamic interaction in this major international economic centre authors survey usage of different languages and attitudes towards them among students teachers and the general population based on census data newspapers language diaries interviews and questionnaires they address issues of code mixing the shift from english medium to chinese medium education the place of putonghua in the local language mix and the language of minority groups such as hong kong indians this wide ranging group of original studies provides a social and historical perspective from which to consider developments in language among the past present and future populations of hong kong

originally published in 1991 the style of this startlingly original appraisal of a broad range of women s writing suggests a new direction for feminist criticism combining as it does challenging intellectual debate and fresh textual analysis with fictional example and autobiographical detail to make a wholly new invention in the field in addressing the need for the critic to say i and to own judgments and statements instead of attributing these to an apparently impersonal third person the author here points up some of the shortcomings of much prevailing feminist analysis challenging the very foundations of the anglo american feminist idea purposely avoiding the totalising effect of much academic criticism the writer critic finds a new format and a new methodology for her insights and observations on a range of writers from doris lessing to hélène cixious her unique analysis of the links between criticism and autobiography enable her to highlight the absurdity of attempting to write in the light of recent critical and scientific knowledge as if the self were a stable unified construct introducing instead a new creative understanding of the methods and modes of women s writing this sparkling collection presents an exciting and original new voice in literary criticism it tackles issues fundamental to literary theory feminist criticism psychoanalysis and cultural studies offering new critical insights and providing a significant and wholly original feminist contribution to these key fields

widely accepted norm within the field of signed language interpreting to date little has been written on simultaneous interpreting in the other language direction in an attempt to bridge this gap wang conducts microanalysis of an experimental corpus of auslan to english simultaneous interpretations in a mock conference setting to investigate different dimensions of quality assessment interpreting strategies cognitive load and the interpreting process itself the focus on conference level simultaneous interpreting not only allows for insights into the impact of signed language variation on the signed to spoken language simultaneous interpreting process but also sheds light on the unique demands of conference settings such as the requirement of using a formal register acting as a bridge between spoken language interpreting studies and signed language interpreting studies and highlighting implications for future research on simultaneous interpreting of other language combinations spoken and signed this book will be of interest to scholars in translation and interpreting studies as well as active practitioners in these fields
