an insider s view of real life in the arab world today written by a couple who has spent 25 years living and working in the middle east

in the ten years since anchor first published elizabeth and robert fernea s award winning the arab world personal encounters vast political and economic shifts have taken place the end of the iran iraq war and the lebanese civil war the outbreak of the gulf war the historic 1993 peace accords between israel and the palestinians to name just a few which is why the ferneas leading scholars in middle eastern studies felt a need to return to the same towns and cities they had written about previously to see how these changes had affected the region and the people who live in it the authors reveal the human face of the arab world as they revisit and talk with newsmakers and colleagues old friends and new their forty years of experience in the region help illuminate the human consequences of changes all too often discussed in abstractions and generalizations the military conflicts new urbanization labor migration religious revival as well as radical changes in the roles of men women and the family with new chapters on baghdad beirut amman jerusalem marrakech and cairo this new edition of the arab world will strengthen its reputation as a book which should be required reading for anyone with a serious interest in the middle east the washington report on middle east affairs

this book explores the emergence of an anarchic states system in the twentieth century arab world following the collapse of the ottoman empire arab nationalist movements first considered establishing a unified regional arrangement to take the empire s place and present a common front to outside powers but over time different arab leaderships abandoned this project and instead adopted policies characteristic of self interested territorially limited states in his explanation of this phenomenon the author shifts attention away from older debates about the origins and development of arab nationalism and analyzes instead how different nationalist leaderships changed the ways that they carried on diplomatic and strategic relations he situates this shift in the context of influential sociological theories of state formation while showing how labor movements and other forms of popular mobilization shaped the origins of the regional states system

cinema in the arab world has been the subject of varied and rigorous studies but most have focused on films as text providing in depth analyses of plot style ideologies or examination of the biographies of prominent directors or actors this innovative new volume shifts the focus on arab cinema off screen to examine the histories politics and conditions of distribution exhibition and cinema going in the arab world through broadening the frame of study beyond the screen the book widens understanding of the cinema not merely as a collection of films as texts but as a site of cultural and political contestation in the arab world divided into two sections and guided by interdisciplinary considerations the contributors examine historical and contemporary issues of arab cinema in terms of the experience of movie going and filmmaking they examine the networks of distribution and exhibition as well as the contested and multiple meanings that the cinema embodied through diverse historical periods and geographical locations part i focuses on new histories of arab cinema in terms of film production distribution exhibition and audience s experiences of cinema going part ii deals with more recent issues within scholarship on arab cinema such as issues of politics economics ideologies as well as issues related to arab movies international circulation and screenings at festivals together the chapters enrich our understanding of the cinema in the arab world showing how deeply embedded it is within its social political and economic contexts

this book first published in 1986 examines the literature on administration human resources and development in the arab world it emphasizes contemporary societies and their internal dynamics the least known and most critical aspects of arabic studies

jeffrey herf a leading scholar in the field offers the most extensive examination to date of nazi propaganda activities targeting arabs and muslims in the middle east during world war ii and the holocaust he draws extensively on previously unused and little known archival resources including the shocking transcriptions of the axis broadcasts in arabic radio programs which convey a strongly anti semitic message herf explores the intellectual political and cultural context in which german and

European radical anti-Semitism was found to resonate with similar views rooted in a selective appropriation of the traditions of Islam. Pro-Nazi Arab exiles in wartime Berlin, including Hajj El-Husseini and Rashid El-Kilani, collaborated with the Nazis in constructing their Middle East propaganda campaign by integrating the political and military history of the war in the Middle East with the intellectual and cultural dimensions of the propagandistic diffusion of Nazi ideology. Herf offers the most thorough examination to date of this important chapter in the history of World War II. Importantly, he also shows how the anti-Semitism promoted by the Nazi propaganda effort contributed to the anti-Semitism exhibited by adherents of radical forms of Islam in the Middle East today.

The advent of the Arab Spring in late 2010 was a hopeful moment for partisans of progressive change throughout the Arab world. Authoritarian leaders who had long stood in the way of meaningful political reform in the countries of the region were either ousted or faced the possibility of political, if not physical, demise. The downfall of long-standing dictators as they faced off with strong-willed protesters was a clear sign that democratic change was within reach. Throughout the last ten years, however, the Arab world has witnessed authoritarian regimes regaining resilience, pro-democracy movements losing momentum, and struggles between the first and the latter involving regional and international powers. This volume explains how relevant political players in Arab countries, among regimes, opposition movements, and external actors, have adapted ten years after the onset of the Arab Spring. It includes contributions on Egypt, Morocco, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Algeria, Sudan, Lebanon, Iraq, Jordan, Yemen, and Tunisia. It also features studies on the respective roles of the United States, China, Iran, and Turkey vis-à-vis questions of political change and stability in the Arab region and includes a study analyzing the role of Saudi Arabia and its allies in subverting revolutionary movements in other countries.

Whereas most studies of Islamism focus on politics and religious ideology, this book analyses the ways in which Islamism in the Arab world is defined, reflected, transmitted, and contested in a variety of creative and other cultural forms. It covers a range of contexts of production and reception from the early twentieth century to the present and with reference to cultural production in and/or about Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Egypt, Yemen, the Gulf, Lebanon, and Israel/Palestine. The material engaged with is produced in Arabic, English, and French and includes fiction, autobiography, feature films, television series, television reportage, the press, rap music, and video games. Throughout the book, highlights the multiple forms and contested interpretations of

islamism in the arab world exploring trends and tensions in the ways islamism is represented to primarily arab audiences and complicating simplistic perspectives on this phenomenon the book considers repeated and idiosyncratic themes modes of characterisation motifs structures of feeling and forms of engagement in the context of an ongoing struggle for symbolic power in the region

two gulf wars and the continuing arab israeli conflict have highlighted the salience of military factors in the middle east this book argues however that many of the most serious security challenges to arab states and societies are rooted not in external military threats but in the imperatives of socio economic development contributors examine the regional security environment the social and political impact of regional militarization and underdevelopment as a source of regional insecurity

this is the first book in english that draws together the work of intellectuals at the forefront of research on the arab region s key human rights issues its empirical and theoretical focus is on the historical and contemporary place of human rights in arab politics and the obstacles to advancing rights in the region
