psychology's study of women has revealed some themes that span cultures and countries yet women's lived experiences in different cultures can be dramatically different this element explores from a psychological perspective women's issues in cultural contexts beginning with the question of public and private identity i.e. who counts as a woman it goes on to examine embodiment sexuality reproduction family roles economic participation and power violence leadership and feminist activism it concludes with a brief discussion of women's complicated relationship to culture as both keepers and sometimes prisoners of cultural traditions particularly in the context of migration to different cultures running through the element are two general themes the pervasiveness of a gender hierarchy that often privileges men over women and the ways in which women's lived experience varies within cultures according to the intersection of gender with other categories that affect expectations norms power and privilege

female anthropologists scan patterns and changes in women's roles in various social systems

until recently women have been noticeably absent from historical and sociological accounts of modernity as a step toward remedying this situation the essays gathered here challenge the continuing separation of sociological from textual analysis in cultural and feminist theory and inquiry they address critically the question of women's writing exploring the idea that women may begin to define their own lives and construct their own identities in a patriarchal culture through the very process of writing they also present a cogent defense of a feminist cultural politics including a politics of the body integrating material drawn from a variety of sources feminist theory cultural and literary analysis sociology and art history *feminine sentences* is an original discussion of women's relationship to modern and postmodern culture janet wolff's book represents a major statement of her distinctive position and will be of interest to everyone working in the areas of cultural and literary theory women's studies and sociology from the book *women are sentenced to containment and silence* this collection is intended as a contribution to the overthrow of that sentence and to the process whereby women find ways to intervene in an excluding culture and to articulate their own experience *feminine sentences* are those formulations and expressions in a variety of cultural forms and media of women's own voice the literature of modernity describes the experience of men it is essentially a literature about transformations in the public world and its associated consciousness in so far as the experience of the modern occurred mainly in the public sphere it was primarily men's experience i want to argue that a feminist cultural politics of the body is a possibility there is every reason to propose the body as a privileged site of political intervention precisely because it is the site of repression and possession

a new and major contribution to the field women in european culture and society is a transnational history of women in europe from the beginning of the eighteenth century that pushes women s history beyond national studies to create an integrated view of three hundred years of women in europe using a *longue durée* the book disentangles the accounts of industrialisation and bourgeois femininity which tend to dominate women s studies and questions the dominant narratives of history drawing on women s own writing and cultural production it presents women as agents of change as well as exploring cultural perceptions of women and the ways in which women have been represented by these discourses it explicitly engages with how women contributed as practitioners to shaping the culture and society of western europe the geographical range and generational breadth of this study provides a cohesive vision of women s lives up to the present day women in european culture and society is an invaluable and essential guide to the conditions circumstances and understandings of how women lived throughout europe

exploring the ways in which women have formed and defined expressions of culture in a range of geographical political and historical settings this collection of essays examines women s figurative and literal roles as sites of culture from the 16th century to the present day the diversity of chronological geographical and cultural subjects investigated by the contributors from the 16th century to the 20th from renaissance italy to puritan boston to the polish lithuanian commonwealth to post war japan from parliamentary politics to the politics of representation provides a range of historical outlooks the collection brings an unusual variety of methodological approaches to the project of discovering intersections among women s studies literary studies cultural studies history and art history and expands beyond the anglo and eurocentric focus often found in other works in the field the volume presents an in depth investigative study of a

tightly constructed set of crucial themes including that of the female body as a governing trope in political and cultural discourses the roles played by women and notions of womanhood in redefining traditions of ceremony theatricality and spectacle women s iconographies and personal spaces as resources that have shaped cultural transactions and evolutions and finally women s voices speaking and writing both as authors of cultural record and destiny throughout the volume the themes are refracted chronologically geographically and disciplinarily as a means to deeper understanding of their content and contexts women as sites of culture represents a productive collaboration of historians from various disciplines in coherently addressing issues revolving around the roles of gender text and image in a range of cultures and periods

the thoroughly revised women in culture 2 e explores the intersections of gender race sexuality gender identity and spirituality from the perspectives of diverse global locations its strong humanities content including illustrations and creative writing uniquely embraces the creative aspects of the field each of the ten thematic chapters lead to creative readings introducing a more readings throughout the text encourage intersectional thinking amongst students humanistic angle than is typical of textbooks in the field this textbook is queer inclusive and allows students to engage with postcolonial decolonial thinking spirituality and reproductive environmental justice a detailed timeline of feminist history criticism and theory is provided and the glossary encourages the development of critical vocabulary a variety of illustrations supplement the written materials and an accompanying website offers instructors pedagogical resources
