abstract this study presents a framework for examining the effects of higher order thinking on the achievement of allied health students enrolled in a pathophysiology course a series of clinical case studies was developed and published in an enriched online environment that guided students through the process of developing a solution and supporting it through data analysis and interpretation the series of case study modules scaffolded argumentation through question prompts the modules began with a simple direct problem and they became progressively more complex throughout the quarter a control group was assigned a pencil and paper case study based upon recall the case studies were scored for content accuracy and evidence of higher order thinking skills higher order thinking was measured using a rubric based upon the toulmin argumentation pattern the results indicated implementing a case study of either online or traditional format was associated with significant gains in achievement the enhanced case studies were associated with modest gains in knowledge acquisition the argumentation scores across the series followed two trends directed case studies were associated with higher

levels of argumentation than ill structured case studies and there appeared to be an inverse relationship between the students argumentation and content scores the protocols developed for this study can serve as a template for a larger extended investigation into student learning in the online environment

gastrointestinal and hepatobiliary pathophysiology conforms to the movement in medical education towards embracing the integration of information and incorporating the skills of knowledge acquisition and problem solving into the learning process along with providing a brief review of the normal structure and function of the gastrointestinal tract this text offers state of the art information about the pathophysiologic basis of gastrointestinal and hepatobiliary diseases although designed as a preclinical text all medical students will find it a useful guide as they move from the study of the basic sciences and begin to address clinical situations the book will also be useful for house officers fellows and practitioners of internal medicine and family medicine as well as for gastroenterologists and hepatologists
