constitute the majority of all companies and provide a major share of jobs the majority of the studies examining business ethics are focused on large corporations using quantitative strategies few studies related to small business have been undertaken the question of how these firms and their owner managers could systematically engage in business ethics and ethical stakeholder management remain unanswered the thesis develops a tool which explicitly addresses this topic the ethics integration guideline on the basis of a research paradigm of constructivism a study was designed which was intended to elicit and then to guide small business owner managers ethical attitudes perceptions and experiences it aimed to develop a structured guideline which can help small firm owners to integrate ethical considerations into their business activities taking owner managers perspectives into account provides insight into the small firms context thus practical applicability of the guideline is provided the results of the research suggested the framework for an ethics integration guideline comprised
