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this volume is one of few surveys in english of the whole of lorca s poetry and the first to concentrate entirely on self consciousness a subject which it sees as central to our understanding of the work of a poet writing in the most self conscious of literary periods the modernist era

garcía lorca at the edge of surrealism the aesthetics of anguish examines the variations of surrealism and surrealist theories in the spanish context studied through the poetry drama and drawings of federico garcía lorca 1898 1936 in contrast to the idealist and subconscious tenets espoused by surrealist leader andré breton which focus on the marvelous automatic creative processes and sublimated depictions of reality lorca s surrealist impulse follows a trajectory more in line with the theories of french intellectuals such as georges bataille 1897 1962 who was expelled from breton s authoritative group bataille critiques the lofty goals and ideals of bretonian surrealism in the pages of the cultural and anthropological review documents 1929 1930 in terms of a dissident surrealist ethno poetics this brand of the surreal underscores the prevalence of the bleak or darker aspects of

reality crisis primitive sacrifice the death drive and the violent representation of existence portrayed through formless base matter such as blood excrement and fragmented bodies the present study demonstrates that bataille's theoretical and poetic expositions including those dealing with the formless and the somber emptiness of the void engage the trauma and anxiety of surrealist expression in Spain particularly with reference to the anguish desire and death that figure so prominently in Spanish texts of the 1920s and 1930s often qualified as surrealist drawing extensively on the theoretical cultural and poetic texts of the period García Lorca at the edge of surrealism offers the first book-length consideration of bataille's thinking within the Spanish context examined through the work of Lorca a singular proponent of what is here referred to as a dissident Spanish surrealism by reading Lorca's surrealist texts including *Poeta en Nueva York* *Viaje a la luna* and *El público* through the bataillean lens this volume both amplifies our understanding of the poetry and drama of one of the most important Spanish writers of the twentieth century and expands our perspective of what surrealism in Spain means

Lorca's drawings and poems focuses on the act of reading Lorca's drawn or written texts and how the reading of one genre can inform the reading of another throughout the study poetry and drawings from every period of Lorca's career are examined selected drawings are interpreted next poems contemporary to those drawings are analyzed in their light in chapter 1 a common poetics is extracted from Lorca's comments about his drawings and writing and placed in the context of the literary and artistic movements of his day the evolution of the literary criticism that examines Lorca's drawings is traced and reviewed Lorca's texts are examined from varying perspectives in the chapters that follow in chapter 2 drawings and poems from 1927 to 1928 are analyzed in light of Lorca's participations in artistic and literary movements during those years texts from each period of Lorca's work are read in chapter 3 in a study of Lorca's employment of space and his depiction of setting and subject in his drawings and poems such a chronological approach allows the reading of Lorca's texts to reveal the evolution of his aesthetics as well as to identify the imagery and techniques that remained consistent throughout his career

the 1930s were one of the most important decades in defining the history of the twentieth century it saw the rise of right-wing nationalism the challenge to established democracies and the full force of imperialist aggression cultural encounters makes an important contribution to our understanding of the ideological and cultural forces which were active in defining notions of national identity in the 1930s by examining the work of writers and journalists from a range of European countries who used the medium of travel writing to articulate perceptions of their own and other cultures the book gives a comprehensive account of the complex intellectual climate of the 1930s

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this study explores the meaning and importance of flamenco in the works of two of the most important and influential figures in 20th-century Spanish culture the poet and playwright Federico García Lorca and the film maker Carlos Saura Lorca and Saura shared a fascination for flamenco as a medium for the existential ideology of the marginalized and disenfranchised and this work evaluates the development of these themes through a close contextual study of their works which are linked explicitly by Saura's film adaptation of Lorca's *Bodas de sangre* and more profoundly by

their use of flamenco to express ideas of sexual and political marginalization in pre and post francoist spain respectively the study demonstrates that an understanding of the symbolism visual style characters themes and performance system of flamenco is key to a greater understanding of the social sexual political and existential themes in the works of lorca and saura

in this fascinating study james kiosses explores the development of imagery in the plays of federico garcía lorca kiosses argues that lorca s use of poetic imagery becomes more dynamic over time shaping dialogue and providing dramatic momentum by employing elements of traditional spanish romance and techniques used by góngora lope de vega and calderón lorca s images not only convey meaning reveal thoughts and heighten emotional content but also constitute a sub text that reflects the sequential movement of action and drama kiosses contends that the poetic imagery in lorca s plays eludes many readers because it is often viewed as a means to enrich dialogue rather than as an integral part of it although there are numerous critiques of lorca s theatrical imagery none has provided an analysis as comprehensive and as interesting as the one kiosses presents in this work

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
