increasingly competitive occupation he gives an in depth and personal look at an industry that in many ways has changed little over the last century and in others has haphazardly evolved as it enters into a ruthlessly competitive world marketplace the prospects for bay fishing a vital part of the cultural identity and tradition of many small coastal towns are uncertain by examining the past and clearing up misperceptions and myths maril provides valuable insight into not just the future survival or demise of one industry in a global economy but the future of small business as a whole

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
