a collection of erotica with a twist the coterie of strange characters includes witches virgins robots clowns aerialists vampires musicians soldiers and automobile fetishists the settings are equally variegated and they include new york s central park the jamaica wildlife preserve planets in other solar systems bars in texas the wide open sky terrorist s camps the afterlife and a courthouse that doubles as a circus
