a prize winning political scientist untangles the deep roots of tribalism in america american politics seems to be in an unprecedented uproar but in this revelatory work of political history james a morone shows that today s rancor isn t what s new the clarity of the battle lines is past eras were full of discord but the most contentious question in american society who are we never split along party lines instead each party reached out to different groups on the margins of power immigrants african americans and women but as the united states underwent profound societal transformations from the civil war to the populist explosion to the great migration to civil rights to the latest era of immigration the party alignment shifted african americans conquered the old segregationist party and democrats slowly evolved into the party of civil rights immigration and gender rights republicans turned whiter and more nativist the unprecedented party lineup now injects tribal intensity into every policy difference republic of wrath tells the story of america as we ve never heard it before explaining the origins of our fractious times and suggesting how we might build a more robust republic

21st century they celebrate opportunity but only for some don't let those people in americans proclaim liberty then wrestle over which kind positive freedom from want or negative no new taxes in this volume morone offers his own answer to the conundrum of american political culture it is a perpetual work in progress immigrants arrive excluded groups demand power and each generation injects new ethnicities races religions ideas foods entertainments sins and body types into the national mix the challengers the devils we know keep inventing new answers to the nation's fundamental question who are we each essay in the devils we know takes up a different aspect of the creative conflicts that shape america ranging from huck finn to obamacare morone explores the ways in which culture interacts with other forces most notably the rules and organizations that channel collective choices the battle to define the nation's political culture spills over into every area of american life but three are especially important democracy economics and morals each in turn complicated by race race race written over 25 years these essays constitute a closely observed and deeply thoughtful vision of what america is its ideas images rules institutions and culture clashes together they explain just why america is the way it is and what it might become

this book argues that long ignored non western political systems from the distant and more recent past can provide critical insights into improving global governance these societies show how successful collective action can occur by dividing sovereignty consensus building power from below and other mechanisms for a better tomorrow we need to free ourselves of the colonial constraints on our political imagination a pandemic war in europe and another year of climatic anomalies are among the many indications of the limits of global governance today to meet these challenges we must look far beyond the status quo to the thousands of successful mechanisms for collective action that have been cast aside a priori because they do not fit into western traditions of how people should be organized coming from long past or still enduring societies often dismissed as savages and primitives until well into the twentieth century the political systems in this book were often seen as too acephalous compartmentalized heterarchical or anarchic to be of use yet as globalization makes international relations more chaotic long ignored governance alternatives may be better suited to today's changing realities understanding how the zulu trypillian alur and other collectives worked might be humanity's best hope for survival this book will be of interest both to those seeking to apply archaeological and ethnographic data to issues of broad contemporary concern and to academics politicians policy makers students and the general public seeking possible alternatives to conventional thinking in global governance

the census plays a foundational if all too easily ignored role in the operation of the american state shaping everything from congressional representation to the allocation of trillions of federal dollars while census taking aspires to the high modernist goal of seeing like a state centralizing standardizing and homogenizing knowledge about a polity it is subject to far more conflict and negotiation than final tabulations maps or technical documentation make apparent this is especially true in a large decentralized polity like the united states where the constitution entrusts the ultimate authority for the census in the legislative branch in counting like a state philip rocco shows how the production of the us census now crucially hinges not only on what happens in washington but also on a series of intergovernmental partnerships state and local officials though not formally responsible for census taking figure importantly in the implementation of the decennial count these officials are essential partners in the construction and maintenance of address lists as well as in outreach and promotion campaigns in hard to count communities the 2020 census compounded these challenges with new crises intergovernmental partnerships played a key role in preventing president trump from adding a citizenship question as state and local officials mounted a coordinated legal counteroffensive many local officials also simply refused to cooperate with the trump administration's efforts to exclude undocumented immigrants from the apportionment count the census also took

place in the context of a global pandemic that stretched administrative resources to the breaking point while these partnerships allowed the census bureau to adapt to ever changing conditions on the ground state and local governments also sounded the alarm when the trump administration sought to rush the census these efforts helped preserve the quality of the data collected in the 2020 count rocco s illuminating study of the 2020 census pulls back the curtain on the administrative state to reveal how something as complex and centralizing as a census takes place within a decentralized federalist system drawing on analyses of interviews with hundreds of public officials and quantitative analyses of state and local census activities counting like a state allows scholars and practitioners to better understand what facilitates as well as what impedes effective intergovernmental partnerships for census taking
