say young Sarah struggles with multiplication facts Traditional testing might only reveal this problem after months of instruction by which point remediation becomes significantly more challenging However through weekly progress monitoring Sarahs teacher identifies the difficulty early on This allows for targeted intervention perhaps extra practice with flash cards engaging games or differentiated instruction long before the gap widens into a significant learning obstacle Why are Weekly Assessments Crucial for Fourth Grade The fourth grade lays the foundation for many future
