- 2 Understanding Vocabulary If you encounter unfamiliar words try to deduce their meaning from the context Use a dictionary if necessary but only after attempting to understand the word within the passage Identifying Key Ideas Pinpoint the main arguments or themes presented in the passage Answering Question Types Different question types require different approaches Factual Recall Directly answer using information explicitly stated in the passage Inference Deduce answers based on implied meaning in the passage Interpretation Analyze the authors tone purpose and message Example Lets say a passage discusses the impact of social media A factual recall question might be What are two negative impacts of social media mentioned in the passage An inference question might be What is the authors overall opinion on social media

- 2 Writing Skills Visual Representation Think of writing as building a house Each part of the writing process planning drafting revising and editing is like building a different section of the house Howto Planning Before you write brainstorm ideas and create an outline This helps structure your thoughts logically Drafting Write a first draft without worrying about perfection Focus on getting your ideas down on paper Revising Review your draft for content organization and clarity Make sure your ideas flow logically and support your main point Editing Check for grammar punctuation spelling and vocabulary errors Different Writing Formats Letters Formal and informal letters require different tones and structures Formal letters are more structured and use polite language while informal letters can be more casual Essays Essays require a clear thesis statement supporting arguments and evidence Reports Reports present factual information concisely and objectively Notices Notices are concise announcements conveying specific information Example For a letter to your principal use formal language and a structured format For a letter to a friend a more casual tone is acceptable

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the french revolution has generally been recognized as the starting point of modernity it is the source in their modern guise of the founding myths of the nation as the basis of political community and democracy and as the only legitimate way of managing political affairs while the revolution narrowly defined has been exhaustively denounced and eulogized its antecedents and more especially its legacies have been neglected after the french revolution aims to rectify this phenomenon it starts by considering the ideological precursors including montesquieu rousseau condorcet and sieyes and the political protagonists notably robespierre and the ideologues who set the scene for nineteenth century debate and action six of the critics of what became the predominant tradition in france are considered in turn ranging from the extreme right to the extreme left maistre represents the reactionary theocratic right while saint simon represents the modernizing industrial right liberalism is advocated by the constitutionalist constant and toqueville the champion of the decentralisation on the left proudhon is the exponent of pluralist and libertarian socialism while blanqui embodies the recourse to revolutionary dictatorship in the concluding chapter jack hayward asks the question is the revolution over while so many in france and elsewhere have sought either to end the revolution or more rarely proclaimed its permanence the revolution as a set of aspirations has not been achieved while france itself has at least stable democratic institutions the expectations aroused two hundred years ago have still not been satisfied the revolution is not yet over

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
