this edited collection of essays answers a basic question posed by contemporary discourse on state building how might people s identification with a particular ethnic group matter essays in this book use an integrated multi disciplinary approach to understanding regional and local community culture and socio political development in developing countries especially in sub saharan africa to argue that the state as well as civil society confers on cultural differences a legitimacy that can be achieved in no other way but by positive cooperation contributors from different countries look at local patterns in state building and modernization as they have unfolded over the course of the last fifty years they claim that the people and ethnic groups in most developing countries adhere to a concept of popular sovereignty that testifies that aspects of positive and moral ethnicity can contribute to social change as in china economic development as in india or in a democratization process as in rwanda and burundi the eventual methodological assumption made by these essays presumes that ethnic conflicts in such countries as cyprus turkey india and rwanda have no moral sanction ethnicity has not assumed a political ideology one conclusion reached by the contributors is that some form of accommodation between opposing ethnically diversified groups as well as between state and ethnic elements is feasible

every chart hides a story and sometimes the best stories are the ones that never existed the mapmaker s mirage takes readers on a lighthearted and educational voyage through the most delightful errors in the history of cartography from phantom islands that never were to misplaced continents that inspired explorers artists and dreamers for centuries told with warmth and humor this book transforms map mistakes into teaching treasures each chapter highlights a famous cartographic misstep like the mysterious island of california the enduring legend of hy brasil and the mirage like sandy island that vanished from modern maps as recently as 2012 rather than mocking the past the mapmaker s mirage celebrates curiosity creativity and the beautifully human desire to fill the unknown with imagination

this timely work interprets baker s landmark study which spaned ten years of the effects of acculturation on the samoans the contributprs assess his findings from a variety of perspectives discussing physical and biological anthropology demography physiology sociology nutrition health and behavior a unique look at all aspects of the impact of technological advances and western influences on developing populations

lance massey and richard gebhardt offer in this collection many signs that composition again faces a moment of precariousness even as it did in the 1980s the years of the great divorce from literary studies the contours of writing in the university again are rapidly changing making the objects of scholarship in composition again unstable composition is poised to move not from modern to postmodern but from process to postprocess from a service oriented field to a research driven discipline some would say we are already there momentum is building to replace composition and the pedagogical imperative long implied in that term with a writing studies model devoted to the study of composition as a fundamental tool of and force within all areas of human activity appropriately contributors here use stephen m north s 1987 book the making of knowledge in composition to frame and background their discussion as they look at both the present state of the field and its potential futures as in north s volume the changing of knowledge in composition describes a body of research and pedagogy brimming with conflicting claims methodologies and politics and with little consensus regarding the proper subjects and modes of inquiry the deep ambivalence within the field itself is evident in this collection contributors here envision composition both as retaining its commitment to broad based generalized writing instruction and as heading toward content based vertical writing programs in departments and programs of writing studies they both challenge and affirm composition s pedagogical heritage and they sound both

sanguine and pessimistic notes about composition s future

story starters and science notebooking developing student thinking through literacy and inquiry is designed to provide a meaningful comfortable framework in which teachers and parents can encourage elementary children to explore scientific ideas in an inquiry oriented format the basis for each scientific concept presented in story starters and science notebooking is embedded in a story appropriate for elementary aged children the activity that follows each narrative encourages learners to observe compare gather data organize or classify and draw conclusions about the problem posed from the story because current scientific knowledge and understanding guide scientific investigations background information in each chapter provides teachers with a synopsis of the scientific concept involved in the activity for that story the story starters present a framework for inquiry which eliminates the free wheeling uncontrolled and unstructured view some teachers have of inquiry these are either original stories or familiar children s stories that ask learners to investigate a possible scientific explanation for a problem or scenario learners then communicate their findings in an oral written pictorial or technological form back to a lead character from the story extension activities provide an opportunity for learners to compare their answers with what scientists already know about the world and also motivate them to frame new questions grades 3 6
