the common practice of ability grouped reading in uk schools often termed guided reading influences children s sense of identity feelings and progress as readers drawing on a rich ethnographic study of three primary classrooms this book reopens a critical inquiry into ability grouped reading that has been quiet since the 1990s when guided reading in literacy education became established practice in the uk and the us through the lens of children s agency in accommodating resisting and at times transforming such reading pedagogy the book shows how readers are shaped by ability grouped reading and by the more egalitarian reading pedagogies introduced in the study children s individual and collective experiences are brought to life through extended narratives that attend as closely to gesture posture visage silences and prosody of speech as to spoken words the book ends with a provocation how literacy pedagogy might change if reflexive noticing and dismantling of hierarchies become the compass of pedagogical change this demands attention to structural inequalities around race gender and class and a turn towards deep listening to children as well as being a valuable read for scholars of the sociology of childhood and education it should appeal to anyone concerned with making education more equitable including teachers school leaders parents carers and policymakers

civics government and economics in action provides an engaging current and relevant look at the foundations of american government citizenship and the american economic and legal systems the program combines an accessible narrative and engaging visual design with a wide variety of instructional tools from workbooks to interactive technology to motivate students to participate make decisions and take action both in and out of the classroom

this powerful text encourages both pre service and established teachers as well as teacher educators to engage with contemporary debates in primary education promoting a critical approach the chapters explore a wide range of key themes including the importance of values in primary education and the imperative for a curriculum which embraces the whole range of available subjects at the same time the chapters are underpinned by a belief that children should be at the heart of all the decisions we make and that primary education should inspire a love of learning for life the book aims to support practitioners to make informed judgements and feel confident to argue their point of view with deeper theoretical knowledge and understanding thus increasing teacher agency and confidence in responding to complex educational and social dilemmas such as literacy levels and rising mental health concerns chapters encompass both the macro aspects of primary education and more specialised debates on key topics such as reading mathematics languages early years education and the use of technology with annotated further reading and reflective questions this key text is essential reading for all those wanting to develop a better understanding of the issues that shape their practice including student teachers at both undergraduate and postgraduate level practising teachers engaged in continuing professional development and teacher educators
