Wideman remains understudied of particular value is Guzzio's analysis of the many ways in which Wideman alludes to his previous works. This intertextuality allows Wideman to engage his books in direct intentional dialogue with each other through repeated characters images folktales and songs in Wideman's challenging of a monolithic view of history and presenting alternative perspectives to it and his allowing past present and future time to remain fluid in the narratives.
