passions and beliefs of the literary artist and the matador respectively and then uses them to underline how both are devoted to exerting and expanding a level of control in their approaches to life and work for the writer this is particularly relevant with regards to his or her handling of inspiration and its implementation in the written word and the paper therefore closes with remarks on whether or not on bullfighting s a l kennedy succeeds in regaining her authoritative power over both aspects of her profession as she struggles through depression and a severe writer s block connected to past emotional trauma

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
