2. Permutations and Combinations

Permutations refer to the arrangements of a set of objects where order matters. For example, the permutations of the letters A, B, C are ABC, ACB, BAC, BCA, CAB, CBA. The number of permutations of n objects is $n!$, where $n!$ denotes the factorial of n (i.e., $n! = n(n-1)(n-2)\dots(1)$). Combinations refer to the selection of objects from a set where order does not matter. For example, the combinations of 2 letters from the set {A, B, C} are AB, BA, AC, CA, BC, CB. The number of combinations of k objects from a set of n objects is denoted by nCk and calculated as $\frac{n!}{k!(n-k)!}$.

Example: A team of 4 needs to be selected from a group of 10 students. This is a combination problem as the order of selection does not matter. We can calculate the number of possible teams using the formula $10C4 = \frac{10!}{4!(10-4)!} = 210$.

3. The Pigeonhole Principle

A simple yet powerful principle in combinatorics is the Pigeonhole Principle. It states that if n items are placed into k containers where $n > k$, then at least one container must contain more than one item.

Example: If you have 13 pairs of socks, you only need to pull out 7 socks to guarantee you have at least one matching pair. This is because if you pull out 6 socks, you could have one of each pair, but the 7th sock must match one of the previous 6.
