around the world we see a participatory turn in the pursuit of gender equality exemplified by the adoption of gender quotas in national legislatures to promote women s role as decision makers we also see a pluralism turn with increasing legal recognition given to the customary law or religious law of minority groups and indigenous peoples to date the former trend has primarily benefitted majority women and the latter has primarily benefitted minority men neither has effectively ensured the participation of minority women in response multicultural feminists have proposed institutional innovations to strengthen the voice of minority women both at the state level and in decisions about the interpretation and evolution of cultural and religious practices this volume explores the connection between gender parity and multicultural feminism both at the level of theory and in practice the authors explore a range of cases from europe latin america the middle east and africa in relation to state law customary law religious law and indigenous law while many obstacles remain and many women continue to suffer from the paradox of multicultural vulnerability these innovations in theory and practice offer new prospects for reconciling gender equality and pluralism

this book explores as one of the priorities of the feminist agenda in the 21st century feminist education and awareness in pre

service and in service teacher training although feminism is constantly present in political discourse and social media it is not examined sufficiently in the classroom this situation means that students approach feminism through media culture lacking the feminist knowledge necessary to teach disciplinary knowledge from the feminist perspective feminist theory as a critical theory provides teacher training based on the formation of critical creative thinking and the resolute interpretation of the relevant social issues of the world in which we live we understand the process of feminist critical literacy outlined here as a plan to find a feminist utopia specifically in the training of teachers from all disciplines although more oriented towards the social and human sciences and artistic education through the use of multimodality as a pedagogical approach if future teachers do not develop feminist cognitive lenses they will not be prepared to teach women s experiences and gender perspectives to their own students this would then contribute to the endurance of an androcentric culture where there are no women s models that can serve as a stimulus or be historical references for female students our idea of feminist critical literacy stems from feminist literary criticism and critical literacy feminist critical literacy is defined as the hermeneutical process of suspicion mainstream culture and of performative deconstruction of multimodal texts didactic produsage the purpose of which is to generate feminist consciousness in teachers from an intersectional perspective through the acquisition of critical creative empathetic aesthetic and empowering competencies that contribute to the formation of a fair equal and equitable glocal citizenship

how can we create writing instruction that allows latine youth to desahogarse where writing is a release how can we learn more about latinx youth and the issues that matter to them so that we can all reimagine a better world in narrative writing with latinx teens testimonios texts and teaching dr carla españa introduces the writing for desahogo teaching framework a

foundation for twenty writing lessons that immerse students in texts on topics that include immigration mental health language resilience and community to facilitate their discussions and writing inspired by research with latinx teens and young adults dr española bookends each chapter with the words of latinx youth and testimonios by latinx educators while inviting teachers to share in the vulnerability of writing to heal with her own creative writing expanding on these topics poems and narratives give readers a lens into dr española s particular experience while setting up teacher and student text sets as entry points into the topic of study each chapter s lesson sequences include four text types for study multimedia introduction poetry immersion middle grade literature young adult literature narrative writing with latinx teens is a weaving of dr española s teaching in different settings with latinx teens in middle grade classrooms and presently in the department of puerto rican and latinx studies at brooklyn college it s reimaged writing workshops meets ethnic studies ultimately this book invites educators to consider the complexity of the latinx diaspora dispel myths of latinidad and consider the ways we can create spaces for the writers in our midst to feel like they can flourish in their criticality and in their joy with a foreword by award winning author arts activist and translator aida salazar narrative writing with latinx teens calls us to grow in our courage curiosity and criticality following the examples of the youth and creators of latin american descent it features and celebrates

toward a cultural archive of la movida revisits the cultural and social milieu in which lamovida an explosion of artistic production in the late 1970s and early 1980s was articulated discursively aesthetically socially and politically we connect this experience with a broader national and international context that takes it beyond the city of madrid and outside the borders of spain this collection of essays links the political and social undertakings of this cultural period with youth movements in spain

and other international counter cultural or underground movements moving away from biographical experiences or the identification of further participants and works that belong to *lamovida* the articles collected in this volume situate this movement within the political and social development of post franco spain finally it also offers a reading of recent politically motivated recoveries of this cultural phenomenon through exhibitions state sponsored documentaries musicals or tourist itineraries the perception of spain as representative of a successful dual transition from dictatorship to democracy and free market capitalism created a spanish model that has been emulated in countries like portugal argentina chile and hungary all formerly ruled by totalitarian regimes while social scientists study the promises contradictions and failures of the spanish *transición* especially on issues of memory repression and the lack of reconciliation our approach from the humanities offers another vantage point to a wider discussion of an unfinished chapter in recent spanish history by focusing on *lamovida* as the cultural archive whose cultural transitions parallel the political and economic ones the transgressive urban nature of this movement demonstrated an overt desire especially among spanish youth to reach onto a global arena emulating the punk and new wave aesthetic of such cities as london new york paris and berlin art design film music fashion during this period helped to forge a sense of a modern urban identity in spain that also reflected the tensions between modernity and tradition global forces and local values international mass media technology and regional customs
