the concepts of genre and ritual are central for the overall occupation with the relationship between the history of the arts and the history of christianity in western culture the present volume was planned on the basis of the first annual international conferences at the centre for the study of the cultural heritage of medieval rituals university of copenhagen a collection of 15 essays with a wide range of topics both in terms of chronology and subject matter written the book is a special issue of the journal transfiguration

appearances can be deceptive and medieval ritual practices are in this respect no exception they perform stability through the codification of repetitive

modes of behaviour and simultaneously admit flexibility in their integration of newer forms of representation they mask the historical contingencies of their own creation and construct alternative narratives of authority and continuity they do not simply appear their appearance reflects the mutual interplay of construction and modification this collection of eleven essays which chronologically spans the period from the carolingians to the catholic reform movement of the later sixteenth century explores this double edged potential in the appearance of medieval ritual practices and in this case chiefly church rituals it comprises a series of individual studies by scholars of literature theology music and the visual arts each study examines a particular moment of change or transformation in ritual practices illuminating thereby processes of ritualization in this way the book both provides an impulse to the recent renewal of methodological interest in ritual studies and presents individual contributions to specific scholarly discourses within this broad area

13 papers by 16 leading archaeologists and historians of late antiquity and the early middle ages break new ground in their discussion analysis and criticism of present interpretations of early medieval rituals and their material correlates some deal with rituals relating to death life cycles and the circulation in other contexts of objects otherwise used in the burial ritual others are concerned with the symbolism and ideology of royal power the formation of a political ideology east of the rhine from the mid 5th century onwards and penance rituals in relation to carolingian episcopal discourse on ecclesiastical power and morale all deal with the creation of new identities cultures norms and values and their expression in new rituals and ideas from the period of the great migrations through the later roman empire down to the society of beowulf and the later carolingians

central to current understandings of medieval history is the concept of political ritual encompassing events from coronations to funerals entries into cities civic games banquets hunting acts of submission or commendation and more ritual asks philippe buc in the dangers of ritual he boldly argues that the concept shouldn't be so central after all modern day scholars gently seduced by twentieth century theories of ritual often misinterpret medieval documents that ostensibly describe such events in part because they fail to appreciate the intentions behind them the book begins with four case studies whose arrangement backward from texts on tenth century kingship to fourth century representations of christian martyrdom allows for the line of development to be peeled back layer by layer it then turns to an analysis of the formation of the intellectual traditions that contemporary historians have employed to interpret medieval documents tracing the emergence of the concept of ritual from the reformation to the mid twentieth century buc highlights the continuities yet also the profound transformations between the early medieval understandings and our own social scientific models medieval historians will find this book an indispensable resource for its insights into methodological issues crucial to their discipline as buc demonstrates only rigorous attention to the contexts within which authors worked can allow us to reconstruct from medieval documents how rituals might have functioned ultimately he argues too swift an application of contemporary models to highly complex textual artifacts blinds us to the specificities of early medieval european political culture

relationships between canonical collections in particular the southern italian collection in five books due in large part to reynolds research the fields of medieval canon law and liturgy are now recognized as fundamental elements of medieval religious and intellectual history that shed light on medieval christian belief and practice the studies are grouped thematically under the headings of ritual and text and law each section has an introduction by the editors in which they survey recent developments in the study of medieval canon law and liturgy with reference to reynolds s own research provide historical context for the individual studies and draw attention to the ways in which the studies reflect current concerns individually the contributors offer new viewpoints on key issues and questions relating to medieval religious cultural and intellectual history particularly of the period c 900 1200 and especially the italian peninsula collectively they illuminate the interaction of medieval christianity and its rituals as well as the relationship of the secular and the sacred as transmitted in liturgico canonical texts from the time of the early church to the 14th century

this multidisciplinary collection of essays explores the functions meanings and use of images and objects in various late medieval and early modern social practices which were linked by their ritual character the book approaches ritual as an action which is discussed under the general umbrella term performative practice and is characterised by a synthesis between the repetitive and the extraordinary that carries an intense symbolic meaning and is emotionally charged images spaces and rituals were closely interconnected in both the religious and the secular spheres and played a relevant role in the symbolic communication of the time the essays in this volume are devoted to a complex study of these phenomena in northern and central europe including regions which due to linguistic or cultural barriers have thus far received comparatively little attention in anglo american scholarship including scandinavia poland and the baltic states

each title in this series brings together a selection of articles by a leading authority on a particular subject these studies are reprinted from a vast range of learned journals conference proceedings and more they make available research that is scattered even inaccessible in all but the largest libraries

in rituals and symbolic communication in medieval hungary under the Árpád dynasty 1000 1301 dušan zupka examines rituals as means of political and symbolic communication in medieval central europe with a special emphasis on the rulers of the Árpád dynasty in the kingdom of hungary particular attention is paid to symbolic acts such as festive coronations liturgical praises welcoming of rulers adventus regis ritualised settlement of disputes and symbolic rites during encounters between rulers the power and meaning of rituals were understandable to contemporary protagonists and to their chroniclers these rituals therefore played an essential role in medieval political culture the book concludes with an outline of ritual communication as a coherent system

this is the first comprehensive english language introduction to taoist ritual both for the scholar and the general reader in this splendid account taoism is presented as a system of religious symbol and action deeply rooted in centuries of chinese social life in vivid detail lagerwey describes the intricacies of
