education has become an increasingly important activity within all economies from pre school years groups through to continuing education and retraining the accumulation of skills spans a lifetime economic principles for education looks at all the major areas of economics applying them to education human capital theory is discussed and evidence on rates of return and the benefits of training is presented the demand for education is described with an assessment of how pervasive wealth effects are in education systems the author discusses the efficiency of education providers including teacher supply and identifies the optimal rules for teacher deployment education markets the role of governments and the macroeconomics of education are all considered along with the key social benefits of education using evidence from a range of countries but particularly the uk and the us clive belfield provides an appreciation of the depth and breadth of the literature of the economic study of education in one easily accessible volume this will be a valuable text for scholars of economics and education and will be welcomed by all those interested in obtaining an overview of the field and in understanding the key principles economists use

this volume introduces the economics as a foundational discipline in education it provides economists and non economists with an accessible grounding in the key concepts and recent developments in the field the book deals with such themes as human capital theory and its alternatives the monetary and non monetary benefits of education the education production function equity in education and the evaluation of education policies in this volume students researchers and policymakers will find an entry point into the way economists think about educational questions and readers will deepen their understanding of the field with state of the art reviews of the main topics that are at the heart of the economist of education today about the educational foundations series education as an academic field taught at universities around the world emerged from a range of older foundational disciplines the educational foundations series comprises six volumes each covering one of the foundational disciplines of philosophy history sociology policy studies economics and law this is the first reference work to provide an authoritative and up to date account of all six disciplines showing how each field s ideas methods theories and approaches can contribute to research and practice in education today the six volumes cover the same set of key topics within education which also form the chapter titles mapping the field purposes of education curriculum schools and education systems learning and human development teaching and teacher education assessment and evaluation this structure allows readers to study the volumes in isolation by discipline or laterally by topic and facilitates a comparative thematic reading of chapters across the volumes throughout the series attention is paid to how the disciplines comprising the educational foundations speak to social justice concerns such as gender and racial equality

understanding education and economics explores the multiple ways in which the field of education and schooling has become closely aligned with economic imperatives and interests and the impact of this on learning and teaching in particular the increasing influence of economic arguments economic ideologies and government involvement in education have made apparent that there is a need to reflect and talk about economic influences and trends in education drawing on the expertise of educationalists around the world the book articulates key debates and theoretical perspectives which can give both students and staff across several courses within the study of education a framework for discussing and analysing how economics defines and shapes the nature and purposes of education the chapters offer discussions and reflections on key issues including the historical developments that led to the creation of a formal education system in england and wales the ways in which neoliberalism underpins education including the coercion of education to serve economic needs the economics of the university as an institution addressing philosophical sociological historical psychological and social issues in education and encouraging readers to pose questions about the nature of education this book is a valuable resource for students and staff alike and will allow them to broaden perspectives on what education could be for and what it should be for

this book is a survey of the principal aspects of the economics of education such as the demand for education as consumption and as an investment good education and economic growth education and manpower needs and the finance of education in some cases in recent years economic theory has been applied to educational problems in order to gain an insight into the workings of the educational system the result has been a certain amount of confusion and distrust among teachers and educationists confusion because some theoretical aspects are not easily understood and distrust of the economist s intrusion into educational policy making this book overcomes these problems by making minimal demands on prior knowledge of economics and by emphasizing the limitations of economic analysis applied to policy matters

economics of education a selected annotated bibliography is an annotated bibliography of the economics of education the criterion of selection is a simple one whether the country or area study contributes to fundamental generalization about the economic aspects or economic role of education the literature on developed countries is distinguished from that dealing with the developing nations comprised of 12 chapters this volume begins with a list of topics for developed countries including the economics and politics of education educational planning manpower forecasting and social mobility and reserves of talent the same topics are addressed in the second part for developing countries the bibliography covers topics ranging from the theory of economic growth and the role of education in social change to the problems of labor and management in economic growth the role of education in social and economic development the economics of public education and the economics of human resources this book will be of interest to economists and educators

this book examines the economic issues of education from an unusually systematic and broad perspective although the book is soundly based in economic theory it is not heavily mathematical economic dimensions in education is designed to provide an introductory analysis of economic issues in education both in academic life and in the general community some of the issues discussed include the nature and reasons for public sector activity in education the role education plays in providing skilled human resources for an economy and the economic consequences of migration between countries of educated peoples the book also deals with various aspects of demand patterns of educational demand individual demand for education as a form of social investment for the community and supply aspects of education as related to types and sizes of educational establishments and problems of ensuring the efficient provision of education there has been a growing interest in the economic aspects of education the considerable growth in the volume of educational activity is now at the point where today education is one of the largest industries in most countries and also one of the chief employers of highly skilled personnel the recognition that education may have a significant influence on the employment and income opportunities and hence affect the distribution of income and wealth in society is also a factor a final reason stems from the post war emphasis on economic growth and development with education playing an important role as a provider of skilled personnel for an economy this classic volume is comprehensive clearly written and will appeal to undergraduates and first year graduate students the treatment is firmly embedded in economic theory and is must reading for those professional economists concerned with education
