this book describes and analyses experiences of teaching and learning language culture and literature based on telecollaboration an approach that creates interactions between groups of learners from different countries through the integration of a series of virtual and intercultural collaborative tasks to the curricula of undergraduate and graduate courses the experiences analyzed in this volume come from two telecollaborative projects developed by the são paulo state university unesp in brazil with universities from other countries the brazilian virtual exchange brave program and the teletandem brasil project the brave program aims at fostering an online collaborative learning modality that promotes intercultural contact and the exchange of ideas by connecting brazilian undergraduate or graduate students with students from different higher education institutions around the world the teletandem brasil project is based on a mode of telecollaboration teletandem that creates a virtual collaborative and autonomous context for learning foreign languages in which two students help each other to learn their own languages or a language of proficiency they do so by using the text

voice and webcam image resources and by adopting the three principles of tandem learning autonomy reciprocity and separate use of both languages language culture and literature in telecollaboration contexts will be of interest to both educational researchers and teachers as it presents on the one hand an innovative tool to promote the democratization of foreign language learning and on the other hand discusses how telecollaborative projects can contribute to the training of language and literature teachers

over the past three decades studies investigating heritage speaker's linguistic competencies have shown time and again that despite being L1 or 2L1 native speakers of their home language s's outcomes display variation across a wide spectrum of differences as compared to each other other types of bilinguals as well as their monolingual peers studies have traditionally used mostly behavioral methodologies rooted in adjacent established fields e.g. L1 acquisition adult L2 acquisition offering in addition to documenting and describing his performance important insights for linguistic theory and challenges related to home minority language maintenance contact policy and more a birds eye view makes it clear that the methodologies one uses to tap into his linguistic knowledge areas if not more are important than the phenomena under investigation especially in light of how their unique experiences with their heritage and other languages are present across a continuum

both language and culture are inseparable parts and yet culture seems absent from most spanish language courses the purpose of this research project is to address the lack of culture integration within a spanish language course the following two questions guided this research project 1 how can integrating more language culture contribute to students learning spanish 2 how can integrating more language culture in the curriculum give students a positive attitude to continue learning the spanish language in the future although multiple reasons exist for this research project one of them is for students to gain an understanding and appreciation of the spanish language culture and their own culture this research project seeks to improve how spanish language educators integrate culture in a spanish language classroom and how culture can benefit students moving forward with spanish language learning the main focus for the author during this research project is in the classroom course book and teachers the author created a handbook so that spanish language educators can integrate without significantly altering their curriculum research in the past has focused on giving the reader an awareness for integrating culture and yet fail to give any tools through this process the author learned that he being a native speaker was failing at integrating the culture into his classroom by integrating the handbook with the current

curriculum of the school students had a positive attitude towards both language and culture and desired to continue learning the language because they wanted to rather than just because it of was a requirement to graduate from high school in conclusion there is a need to integrate more culture within the confines of a spanish language classroom the research project can be integrated to most levels of spanish but there is still a need for more activities for the upper levels this research project contributes to the field of education by creating a handbook that spanish language educators can use to integrate in their curriculum
