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what are the characteristic features of avatar based singleplayer videogames from super mario bros to grand theft auto rune klevjer examines this question with a particular focus on issues of fictionality and realism and their relation to cinema and virtual reality through close up analysis and philosophical discussion klevjer argues that avatar based gaming is a distinctive and dominant form of virtual self embodiment in digital culture this book is a revised edition of rune klevjer s pioneering work from 2007 featuring a new introduction by the author and afterword by stephan günzel jörg sternagel and dieter mersch

video games and comedy is the first edited volume to explore the

this book constitutes the second part of the proceedings of the 15th asian conference on intelligent information and database systems aciids 2023 held in phuket thailand during july 24-26 2023 the 50 full papers included in this book were carefully reviewed and selected from 224 submissions they were organized in topical sections as follows computer vision cybersecurity and fraud detection data analysis modeling and processing data mining and machine learning forecasting and optimization techniques healthcare and medical applications speech and text processing
